
What is Health Impact Assessment?

Health Impact Assessment (HIA) is a structured process that combines scientific evidence and community engagement to inform decision-makers about how they can increase the positive health benefits and reduce the negative health impacts of new infrastructure development. It also looks at how the benefits of development can be shared equitably and fairly across all affected communities.

What has the Asian Development Bank done?

In November 2014, the Asian Development Bank (ADB) approved a regional technical assistance project on Results for Malaria Elimination and Communicable Diseases Control in Asia and the Pacific. This provided ADB with an opportunity to initiate and further mainstream HIA in the region, starting with Greater Mekong Subregion (GMS),^a through **capacity development, improving regulatory and policy frameworks, undertaking demonstration projects, and developing HIA tools and resources**. It focused on improving HIA practice at three levels; regional, in countries of the GMS, and within ADB.

- Development of HIA capacity at the country level involved close collaboration between ministries of health and ministries for the environment. This facilitated integration of health more broadly into existing impact assessment processes and increased momentum for stronger HIA.
- Collaboration with academic institutions has been initiated to help sustain HIA capacity development including expanding HIA teaching and research in Asia and the Pacific region.

REGULATION AND POLICY FRAMEWORKS

Sound policy and regulatory frameworks were developed. Myanmar and Viet Nam government counterparts have completed their respective draft HIA guidelines. Integration of health into the environmental impact assessment process has also been initiated in Cambodia, Myanmar, and Viet Nam. Lao PDR held national consultations on updating their existing national HIA guidelines, taking into consideration 10 years of HIA experience.


