10th ADB International Skills Forum:

A New Era of Digitalized and Climate Resilient Human and Social Development 17–19 October 2023, ADB Headquarters, Manila

Today, a new vision for education is called for amid far-reaching market changes in an increasingly technology-enabled world. A reimagining of skills and workforce development is critical to ensure that talent keeps pace with changing demand from employers and the aspirations of young people. Education and training are powerful levers by which policy makers can navigate disruptive changes and harness the benefits of technologies for the poor and vulnerable.

ADB will host the 10th International Skills Forum to explore key issues confronting education across kinder to grade 12 (K-12), technical and vocational education and training (TVET), and higher education. The Forum will address three over-arching topics – digital transformation, climate change and inter-disciplinary education. The rise of big data, artificial intelligence (AI), and growing human—machine collaboration spell new frontiers for productivity and market expansion. Realizing the potential of technology requires timely investments in higher-order education and skills development. Innovations and knowledge accumulation can help to shape a climate-resilient and sustainable future. Quality of learning is crucial in a post-COVID 19 era to address the learning crisis as well as the mismatch with the future of jobs amidst digital transformation and green transition.

This flagship event of ADB's Education Sector Group brings together key stakeholders in the Asia and Pacific region and beyond—policy makers, officials, and project managers of ADB projects, academia, private sector, international organizations, and leading global experts.

The objectives of the Forum include the following:

- 1. To chart new directions and improve the quality of education by harnessing the potential of digital transformation in education, particularly, the Fourth Industrial Revolution, digital platforms for education, micro credentials and blockchain, generative AI and big data.
- 2. To amplify the role of education and training through incorporation of climate change curriculum, skills development for just transition and climate resilient occupations and investment in research and innovation to promote climate technologies and knowledge.
- 3. To enhance the impact of investments in education through multi-disciplinary approaches and connecting different sectors such as the health, medical and care economy, creative industries, clean energy, rail sector and e-mobility and smart cities.

The event will be held in a hybrid mode in order to facilitate wide participation. The Forum includes the Innovation Marketplace exhibition and demonstrations to showcase a range of products and services, including education technology.
