

## Challenges in education

#### **SCHOOL LEVEL**

- Despite improved access, around 100 m students are still out of school and many more are leaving schools without learning
- 21<sup>st</sup> century skills require relevant curriculum, and motivated teachers and principals
- Lack of career counseling and guidance

#### **TVET LEVEL**

- Largely school-based and supply-driven
- Limited involvement of employers and companies
- Lack of focus on soft skills

#### HIGHER EDUCATION

- Growing enrollment but high graduate unemployment
- Unsatisfactory quality
- Detached from national development

#### **Cross-cutting**

- Gender disparity persists
- Limited partnerships between education institutions, industry and employers
- Limited use of technology/digital skills
- Lack of coherent strategy to deal with Industry 4.0


### **Education Sector Portfolio**

- 2018 was a milestone year for the education sector
  - Reached \$1.738 billion approvals
  - \$1.65 billion commitment
  - Over 7% of total ADB lending
- Total lending portfolio as of 15 March: \$5.63 billion
- Sub-sector focus on technical and vocational education and training; and K-12 reforms
- Largest share of South and Southeast Asia




### **Top 10 Borrowers**

- Cross-sector collaboration (e.g. elderly care, urban development, agriculture, infrastructure, entrepreneurship)
- ADB-BMZ-GIZ partnership to pilot workforce development in ADB-funded infrastructure projects (e.g. Mongolia)
- Focus on high technology including the use of ADB's High Level Technology Fund for improving education
- Strengthen student assessment systems to improve learning
- Use of AI and big data analytics for labor market intelligence systems
- Assess readiness of education and training in select ASEAN countries for higher level skills and readiness for Industry 4.0
- Explore opportunities to increase private equity investment in education to support equity and quality
