Total Cost: approximately 7 Billion USD


Project Alignment: 50 km, 30-60m ROW, Depot 70 Ha.

Livelihood impacts are mostly small-scale and household based





Good Practices

- Adequate consultations with all stakeholders
- Compensation at replacement cost
- On site resettlement, when possible
- Income restoration and livelihood programs
- Social support (education, health, culture)

Grievance Redress Mechanism

scaled to risk and impacts
prompt, understandable and transparent
gender and culturally sensitive
at no cost and without retribution

GRM: must not impede access to judicial and administrative remedies.
