Enhance capacity and knowledge to integrate environment-related SDGs into policy and planning processes


Provide tools and guidance materials and technical assistance in developing national implementation plans



Biodiversity across the region is declining and land degradation has escalated.

60% decline in species since 1970

23-55% rural populations with degraded agricultural land



**Water scarcity rising with overconsumption,
pollution and climate change.**



Ocean health and productivity declining

Asia and the Pacific region produces 80% of the world's aquaculture and 60% of capture fisheries.

Marine populations have declined by 49% in the past 50 years
No exploitable wild fish stocks for commercial fishing by 2048




Waste generation outstrips disposal capacity, leading to marine and land pollution.

Less than 20% of wastewater treated
75% of municipal waste collected but **less than 60%** treated




Air pollution is choking Asian Cities.

95% of cities with >100,000 people with poor AQ.
4.5 million annual premature deaths globally from air pollution – related diseases are in Asia



Health Effects of Air Pollution



Greenhouse gas emissions have grown faster than the rest of the world, and risks and impacts from climate change are rising quickly.
