Catalyzing people-centric smart city transformation in Southeast Asia through digital solutions

The ASEAN Australia Smart Cities Trust Fund (AASCTF) assists selected ASEAN cities in enhancing their planning systems, service delivery, and financial management by developing and testing appropriate smart urban solutions and systems. By working with cities, AASCTF facilitates their transformation to become smarter and more livable—thereby, more green, competitive, resilient, and inclusive, so that the uniquely vibrant cultures, economies, and urban ecosystems of the ASEAN region prosper, leaving no one behind.

Established in April 2019, AASCTF is a single-donor trust fund financed by the Government of Australia, through its Department of Foreign Affairs and Trade (DFAT), managed by the Asian Development Bank (ADB), and implemented by global consulting firm Ramboll.

WHICH ASEAN CITIES ARE SUPPORTED BY AASCTF?

AASCTF is currently working with 24 cities across 8 ASEAN countries. Support under AASCTF is provided in varying levels of engagement, technical assistance, and financing, depending on DFAT priorities, ADB investments, and the cities' needs. There are 9 cities with direct pilot intervention support, while there are two regional programs open to all AASCTF participating cities – some of these are completed and others will be completed by the end of 2023 or early 2024.
