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#### **Response to COVID-19**

- Cambodia responded to COVID-19 pandemic under the strong leadership of Samdech Akka Moha Sena Padei Techo HUN SEN, former Prime Minister of the Kingdom of Cambodia,
- Now is striking-back for socio-economic recovery growth, and resilient health system against the future pandemic and health emergency.
- Adapted 'risk-balance approach' to quickly, swiftly and effectively implemented public health measures, with an early planning for COVID-19 vaccination- COVID-19 primary vaccination series coverage of over 70% of the total population in September 2021
- Successful implementation of a social support program, launched in June 2020, has moderately mitigated the negative impact of COVID-19 on socio-economy

### **Response to COVID-19**

→ Created a favorable condition for reopening the country and socio-economic activities in November 2021.

→ Contributing to global health security whilst also maintaining other significant health gains, e.g. further reduction of maternal and early childhood mortality.

### Resilient health systems learn and adapt

- The COVID-19 pandemic highlighted that when health is at risk everything is at risk. Investing in health is not a cost but an investment in social and economic stability, growth and resilience.
- As directed by evidence and Cambodia's national needs and priorities, the Royal Government's priority directions are to further strengthen resilient health systems towards Universal Health Coverage (UHC).
  - ✓ Ensuring health security: preparedness and operational readiness of the health system for and effectively address growing public health threats and emergencies;
  - ✓ maintain access to essential quality services during an emergency; and
  - ✓ Ensure access to essential health services and critical care without risk of financial hardship,
  - ✓ Maintaining health gains,

#### Ways forward

- Shifting the health system toward more sustainable long-term response to COVID-19
- Empowering individuals and communities to make the right choices that saves lives and sustains livelihoods.
