




Maximizing development effectiveness of ADB operations through evaluation feedback



Annual Evaluation Review 2023



- Government and institutional readiness more likely to lead to project success.
- Larger implementation teams are associated with lower project success.
- Complex projects are likely to overwhelm implementing agency capacities.
- Most higher-performing projects focus on strengthening the capacity of government agencies
- Projects delegated to ADB's country offices in a timely manner likely to perform better



Sector Assistance Programs | Energy

Context

- D Political factors that support status quo and resist reforms can slow down improvements.
- D Power sector SOEs often lack focused incentives to improve performance.
- Hindrances to coordinated problem solving enhancing inter- and intra-agency coordination.
- □ Revenue levels below cost-recovery push power sector entities into revolving debt.

Recommendations

- □ Improvement of governance in the power sector.
- □ Support long-term, integrated system planning and management systems.
- Target underlying causes of revenue shortfalls and implement cost recovery tariffs.
- Distribution sector financials efficient and modern infrastructure, reduce theft, automated metering,
- Renewables and energy conservation can improve sector financials and alleviate fuel import dependance.

- □ Project administration success relies on capacity and commitment of executing agencies.
- Executing agency and PMU prior experience with IFI–financed procurement plays a key role.
 - Capacity building of the executing agency and PMU can lessen project implementation delays.
 - Establishing performance indicators for capacity building are important.
 - □ Strengthening financial management integral to capacity building.
 - □ Institutional strengthening should continue even after the ADB engagement.
- Institutional changes can create challenges to information collection, non-compliance with ADB guidelines.
 - □ Maintaining key specialists after major reforms helps retain institutional memory.
- Rigorous data collection on agreed indicators facilitates reliable assessment of performance.
 - Establishing the PPPMS at preparation stage with baseline data and routine monitoring.
