Political Economy Analysis Workshop

Preparation of PEA Toolkit for Application in ADB Work in DMCs

Introduction

Political economy considerations have an impact on economic development. Political economy analysis (PEA) can strengthen the diagnosis of development problems, assessment of risks, and the design of more effective support, leading to better development results.

To assist in this, ADB has already developed the relevant Guidance Note for staff's consideration.¹ The Note not only explains the concept of political economy but also delimits the scope of what is included in PEA. What is considered missing in the Guidance Note is a 'how-to" tool to guide staff members in carrying out the PEA. This workshop will help collective development of the toolkit.

Rationale and Objectives of the Workshop

At the Asian Development Fund (ADF) Replenishment meetings in 2011 and 2012, ADF donors emphasized the importance of understanding the political economy of developing member countries (DMCs) in our development operations in the region. The ADB Board of Directors has also encouraged political economy analysis to be made an integral part of assessments of the country and sector situation in the development of new programs, projects, and partnership strategies. The Governance CoP has informed Management that it will prepare all relevant materials and toolkits for this purpose.

This workshop aims to ensure not only that expert input is incorporated in the exercise but also that relevant ADB staff members themselves contribute to preparing the toolkit on PEA.

Approach and Methodology

The approach and methodology to be used at the workshop will have the following characteristics: (i) be interactive—whereby participants will work closely with each other to share relevant ground-level experiences that can inform the toolkit; (ii) based on application—such ground-level experiences will be incorporated in the toolkit to be developed during the workshop; and (iii) directed by workshop participants—while an external expert will be involved in providing the right frame of reference, the toolkit itself will be developed by the workshop participants. All participants will be required to come to the workshop with relevant case studies that can demonstrate the practicality of the toolkit.
