Asia Leadership Program on Sustainable Development and Climate Change

The Asia Leadership Program delivered by ADB and its knowledge partners targets policy makers in the ADB's client countries. It aims to contribute to poverty alleviation by inspiring leadership and empowering participants through the acquisition of regionally relevant insights and skills. Through highly interactive learning methods, the Asia Leadership Program acts as a change agent in stimulating participants to integrate sustainable development and climate change (SD&CC) priorities into policies, strategies, and programs.

Rationale

Poverty reduction remains the greatest challenge for developing Asia and the Pacific. Nearly half of Asia's citizens—about 1.8 billion people—still live on less than \$2 a day. Many reside in megacities with populations of over 10 million where pollution compounds the problems associated with mass urbanization. **The interconnections between sustainable development, climate change, and poverty reduction are clear.**

The current development paradigm is unsustainable, and without strong innovative responses, these impacts are likely to intensify already known development challenges, including population growth, rapid urbanization, energy-food-water security, health, and social dimensions.

Vision

Empowered and committed leaders who integrate SD&CC initiatives into national priorities and action plans with the end goal of reducing poverty in the Asia and Pacific region.

Goal

By focusing on the three pillars of policies, finance, and technology, develop leaders in sustainable development and climate change initiatives in the Asia and Pacific region through knowledge sharing and partnerships.
