■ **Background**

In the international development field, Managing for Development Results(MfDR) has emerged as a global initiative for the effective “results-oriented” management system. When it comes to its implementation, the MfDR accepts tenets of “good governance” described as “clear objectives, evidence-based decision-making, transparency, and continuous adaptation and improvement” at all phases of the national development process. In the mid 2000’s, three main CoPs (Communities of Practices) from each region, Latin-America and Caribbean, Asia, and Africa, were established as “peer-to-peer collaborative networks” to achieve the successful fulfillment of MfDR.

■ **Objectives and Target Audience**
