#### A. Introduction

1. Good governance and effective public management are essential for achieving country and sector-level development results. As stated in the Asia 2050 report of the Asian Development Bank (ADB), the message is clear – governance improvements across a range of dimensions, and across the Asia-Pacific region, will be key in determining whether a developing member country (DMC) is able to accelerate development and inclusive growth. Good governance is now generally accepted as an instrumental variable in how countries can reduce poverty through strong local institutions.

2. The Governance Thematic Group (GovTG) at ADB, and the ADB Institute (ADBI) in Tokyo, have teamed up to offer a Forum on Governance and Institutions to provide a platform for senior officials of ADB's DMCs – as well as of the ADB itself – to discuss issues of note in governance and public sector management (PSM). The inaugural session of the annual Forum was held in November 2016 at the ADB Institute in Tokyo and focused on the primary theme of "Governance Issues in Domestic Resource Mobilization". The second one was held in Seoul in August 2017, with the focus on local governance and service delivery.

3. The annual Forum focuses on specific topics that are germane to the issue of governance and institutions in the Asia Pacific region. It seeks to provide an appropriate forum for government officials to discuss relevant governance issues and, in the process, guide ADB on where and how it can suitably channel its investments for development operations. The participants of the annual Forum are generally: (a) senior managers and staff members of ADB; (b) senior officials of DMC governments that manage the ADB portfolio; (c) noted global experts on the various areas of governance work; and (d) other invited guests and participants from within ADB, the host country of the Forum, and elsewhere.

#### **B.** Objectives of the Forum

4. The objectives of the Forum, in general, include:

- a. Enhance understanding of global trends in the various areas of governance and public sector management as well as of global agendas, primarily Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), COP21 (21<sup>st</sup> Conference of Parties) for climate action, base erosion and profit shifting, the Addis Agenda on Financing for Development, and others).
- b. **Share ADB's experiences in its sectors** and sub-sectors of operations (including, eg, state-owned enterprise reforms, domestic resource mobilization and tax administration reforms, subnational governance and local level service delivery, etc.).
- c. *Hear from DMC governments* what their needs are in public sector management reforms (as well as in governance broadly), and how ADB can better address their needs.
- d. Assess how ADB can scale up operations on public sector management.

#### C. 2018 Forum: Issues in SOE Reforms and Corporate Governance

5. The 2018 Forum will be held in Seoul (11-13 June 2018), in partnership with Korea Development Institute. The focus of the 2018 Forum will be on issues related to reforms of state-owned enterprises and corporate governance. This sub-sector of public sector management is one of three main areas of focus of the Governance Thematic Group (the other two being "domestic resource mobilization" and localizing global agendas and local governance" – both of whom have been discussed in prior Forum workshops). For SOE reforms, among other things, good corporate governance (as with the private sector) is a must for successful policy outcomes. Indeed, weaknesses in corporate governance are almost always responsible for the poor investment decisions and risky financing practices that lead to non-performing loans and large-scale bankruptcies. Which is why it makes sense to discuss this topic during the Third Forum, jointly with Korea Development Institute, which has developed a skills development program specially targeted to ADB programming in mind in this sub-sector.<sup>1</sup>

6. The 2018 Forum will be based on a twin track approach: (a) Component 1 (on the first day of the three-day program) will concentrate on the overall context of governance and PSM in which SOE reforms and issues of corporate governance feature; and (b) Component 2 on the second and third days will include a SOE-specific skills development program that is tied to the learning of the first day discussions. The first portion, on 11 June 2018, will be facilitated by the Governance Thematic Group of ADB; while the second one (on the 12<sup>th</sup> and 13<sup>rd</sup> of June) will be facilitated by KDI, which has developed the training program.

### D. 2018 Forum, Learning Objectives, and Methodology

7. Table 1 lists the learning objectives of the 3<sup>rd</sup> ADB-ADBI Forum on Governance and Initiatives.

8. The methodology of the Forum focuses on operationalizing the recently prepared Strategy 2030. This is part of the attempt to take a more holistic view of reforming SOEs, and instituting principles of good corporate governance in these public entities. Individual panel sessions in the Forum (for both components) will be used to elicit practical ideas on how to enhance ADB operations on the ground on SOE reforms and other areas of PSM. Finally, the structure of the Forum will enable substantial learning from peers.
