





ADB-KEDI Webinar on Capacity Building for Educational Professionals in Uzbekistan

"Searching for the role of education research institute: Exploration of best cases and practices responding to the needs of the future society"

Uzbekistan established a five-year Education Sector Plan (ESP) 2018-2023 for providing a strategic vision for developing the education sector in the country. The ultimate goal of ESP is "Children and youth prepared for life through quality education and lifelong learning, leading to an improved quality of life, enhanced job opportunities and a consistent increase in real income. For the ESP 2018-2023, three overarching policy goals have been presented, which are: (1) Ensuring equitable access to and participation in education at all levels; (2) Enhancing the quality and relevance of education at all levels to improve learning outcomes and competencies/skills; and (3) Enhancing service delivery for efficient, effective and equitable distribution of results on access and quality. In addition, Country Operations Business Plan (2019-2021) includes education projects for improved and demand-driven technical and vocational education and training system that is more responsive to labor market needs.

As part of this effort, the Avloniy Institute (Scientific Research Institute for Studying the Issues and Determining the Perspectives of Public Education named after A. Avloniy) is seeking a transformation from a long-standing teacher training institute to a scientific research institute in response to the national strategic plan. The institute has a vision "To become a strong foundation for the prosperity of science and education in Uzbekistan" and sets three objectives: (1) To reach excellence in research; (2) To contribute to evidence-based policymaking; (3) To provide lifelong learning for school principals and teachers.

In order to help achieve these goals of the Avloniy Institute, Korean Education Development Institute (KEDI) and Asian Development Bank (ADB) have collaboratively designed a customized capacity-building webinar for education professionals aligned with to the needs of Uzbekistan. This webinar intends to support Avloniy Institute members and educational professionals in Uzbekistan to continue to respond to the emerging challenges and explore ways for better educational practice.

- Promoting understandings of the overall role and function of the education research institute
- Sharing knowledge and policies on educational statistics for evidence-based education policies
- Deriving implications through examples of major practices in primary and secondary education
 - How to support STEM education implementation in schools: Curriculum Standard, Teaching Methodology, School Leadership, Digital Platform
