## Workshop Background and Goals

Citywide Inclusive Sanitation (CWIS) is a new approach to delivering urban sanitation intervention in low- and middle-income countries. It is strikingly different from conventional approaches, which are predominantly sewer focused and have a top-down planning approach. CWIS aims to achieve the urban sanitation targets envisioned in the Sustainable Development Goal 6 in a sustainable and equitable way. This is done through prioritizing contextual solutions that may be sewer or non-sewer, meaningfully involving local stakeholders and marginalized communities, providing an enabling environment for private sector participation and creating a strong monitoring and regulatory framework to ensure that fecal waste is safely managed throughout the value chain.

Since CWIS is in line with ADB's goal of "Accelerating Sanitation for All in Asia and the Pacific" and the Bank has recognized its importance, strengthening its position and awareness among ADB stakeholders is key. The ADB Sanitation Dialogue provides a great opportunity to raise this awareness geared towards action for its member countries and support staff at large.

This CWIS workshop has the aim of bringing about 50 participants together to (i) sensitize them about the CWIS approach, (ii) expose them to various exemplary case studies and (iii) inform them about the plethora of tools that enable the planning, implementation and monitoring of CWIS interventions. The workshop will be an interactive session leveraging online tools such as Mentimeter, Zoom Breakout Groups and Miro Boards. The workshop is structured into three parts: (1) introduction to the CWIS concept (2) World Café with experts (3) Tools and Resources. The first part will have a detailed introduction to the concept where the Manila Principles on CWIS are introduced along with practical implication of CWIS. The second part will bring three external experts as invited speakers to host a virtual world café explaining their experiences with CWIS. The third and final part will give an overview of the canvas of tools available for practitioners and a short dive into select tools.

As success parameters, at the end of the workshop, participants are expected to have a basic understanding of the background and concept of CWIS along with real examples. The participants will be able to identify the necessary tools and resources in accordance to the stages of CWIS planning and implementation. They are also likely to meet other practitioners across the Asia-Pacific, who are just as interested in CWIS and could engage in peer learning. All participants will receive a CWIS resource list as a take-home sheet which will be a catalogue of CWIS knowledge, tools, guidelines, videos etc. Ultimately this workshop will be a short yet immersive experience of engaging with the CWIS concept and understanding what is required to put it in practice.
