# **Jumpstarting S2030: Tapping the Power of Inclusive Design!**



Along with rapid urbanization occurring in many countries in Asia and the Pacific, one of the urban development challenges faced by cities is addressing the needs of its aging population and people with disabilities. By 2030, Asia will be the second fastest aging region in the world at 66% expected increase in the 60 and over age group. This spells the need to make urban development and services more inclusive.

The Asian Development Bank (ADB) is committed to promoting a healthy city that upholds equality and well-being as reflected in the ADB Strategy 2030. ADB, through its Social Development Thematic and Urban Sector Groups, has partnered with the Global Disability Innovation (GDI) Hub in organizing an Inclusive Design Bootcamp for ADB staff to further their professional development in this important area of global policy and practice.

The content of this bootcamp will be driven by GDI Hub's world leading experience in inclusive design of the built environment, which is based on University College London (UCL)'s award nominated Master's Programme and adapted specifically for ADB operations.

This will begin with a bank-wide kickoff event on Jumpstarting S2030: Tapping the Power of Inclusive Design with global inclusive design leaders. The kickoff will be followed by the Inclusive Design Bootcamp which is a set of Training Sessions for 20 selected participants who will learn how to deliver inclusive design outcomes. Participants will be awarded a Certification of Participation from GDI Hub and UCL, and will be able to gain ongoing support from the network of alumni and GDI Hub.

Based at UCL, GDI Hub bring vast global research and practice experience, having grown out of the London 2012 Games, and currently operating in more than 35 countries with over 70 partners across programme investment of more than £50m.

#### **Kickoff Event Speakers**



Bambang Susantono Vice-President for Knowledge Management and Sustainable Development, ADB

Mr. Susantono assumed the position in July 2015. He is responsible for management of ADB's Sustainable Development and Climate Change Department, Economic Research and Regional Cooperation Department, and Department of External Relations. He supervises the development of ADB's flagship publications and reports on Asia's Key Development Indicators, Asia Development Outlook, and Economic Indicators. He provides strategic leadership on ADB's commitment to the global sustainability and climate change agenda. Prior to this, Mr. Susantono was the Vice-Minister of Indonesia's Ministry of Transportation and Deputy Minister for Infrastructure and Regional Development. He has extensive experience providing policy advice to government, private sector organizations and international institutions. More details here.



Chris Holmes
Paralympic Champion and Inclusion Advocate, UK Parliament

Mr. Holmes is a passionate advocate for the potential of technology and the benefits of diversity and inclusion. He is a member of the influential House of Lords Select Committee on Science and Technology. He is also co-chair of British Parliamentary Groups on Fintech, Al, Blockchain, Assistive Technology and the 4th Industrial Revolution. Mr. Holmes was the non-Executive Director at the Equality and Human Rights Commission (2013–2017) where he headed up the Disability Committee and was responsible for important diversity and inclusion programmes, ranging from sport to broadcasting and precedent setting legal action concerned with the Equality Act 2010 and establishing principles around accessibility and inclusion. As an ex-Paralympic swimmer, he won nine gold, five silvers and one bronze medal across four Games, including a record haul of six golds at Barcelona 1992. More details here.



Victor Santiago Pineda President, World Enabled

Mr. Pineda is the President of World Enabled and has co-led the Smart Cities for All Toolkit with The Global Initiative for Inclusive Information and Communication Technologies. He also serves as President of the Global Alliance on Accessible Technologies and Environments. Mr. Pineda is a recognized leader in international disability rights and was appointed by US President Barak Obama to the Architectural and Transportation Barriers Compliance Board. He teaches city planning and directs the Inclusive Cities Lab at University of California, Berkeley. Mr. Pineda has received numerous awards, including a National Science Foundation Innovation research grant, a Fulbright Hays Scholarship, and the Jefferson Award for Public Service. Bruno Carrasco

Director General and concurrently Chief Compliance Officer, SDCC, ADB

Mr. Carrasco leads ADB-wide knowledge, innovation, policies and strategies in all thematic and sector operation areas and ensures compliance with environment and social safeguards policies. Academic Director, Global Disability Innovation Hub

Professor Holloway is GDI Hub's Academic Director and a creative leader who looks to expand the role and relevance of academia through her research, teaching, engagement and innovation activities. She is pioneering the Disability Interaction Framework to help accelerate disability innovation for a fairer world. This work spans the domains of human-computer interaction, accessibility and assistive technology and policy.



Wendy Walker
Chief of the Social Development Thematic Group, SDCC, ADB

Ms. Walker is co-leading the first operational priority of Strategy 2030 on addressing remaining poverty and inequality which focuses on ensuring inclusive access to opportunities. She has led multisector teams in designing and implementing complex and innovative projects and has worked across diverse sectors such as social protection, education, transport, urban, and health. Ms. Walker has been leading the team developing ADB's Road Map for Strengthening Disability Inclusive Development, 2021–2025, and is involved in other initiatives supporting inclusion in ADB's operations.
