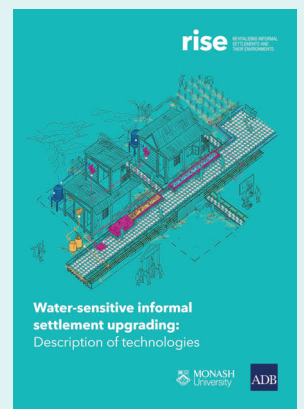
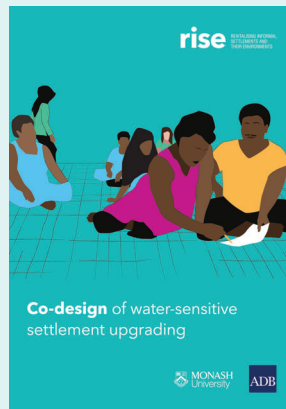
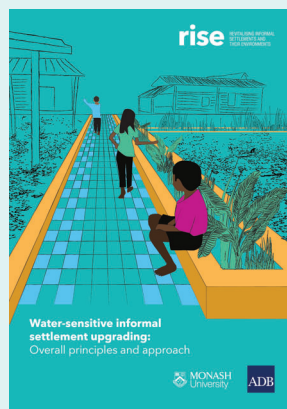
## Showcasing the possibilities, principles and best practices for a water-sensitive cities approach to transform urban health and well-being.
