REDUCING PLASTIC POLLUTION AND PROMOTING GREEN BUSINESSES


The Environment Thematic Group and the Urban Sector Group will run a four-part sprint series called "Closing the Circle: Reducing Plastic Pollution and Promoting Green Businesses," with a special session tailored for the Private Sector Operations Department (PSOD). The training aims to introduce the concept of a circular plastics economy (CPE) and upskill Asian Development Bank (ADB) personnel in identifying opportunities to mainstream CPE in project preparation and operations. Participants are encouraged to attend all sessions, but each one is designed to be stand-alone.
