RCI Dashboard – Harnessing Power BI for monitoring RCI Operations

28 July 2023 (Friday) I 2:00-3:30 pm (Manila time) via MS Teams

The Regional Cooperation and Integration and Trade Division (CCRC) organized the RCI and Trade Innovations Seminar Series No. 14 on 28 July 2023 from 2:00 to 3:30pm via MS Teams with more than 30 participants across ADB. The session presented Power BI as a powerful business intelligence tool for data visualization and introduced the RCI Dashboard by showing how to tap Power BI in developing similar databases.

Welcome Remarks.

Cyn-Young Park, Director, Regional Cooperation and Integration and Trade Division (CCRC), CCSD, in her Welcome Remarks, mentioned that the RCI Dashboard was developed to help gather information on RCI operations using information from eOps and harnessing the strength of Power BI. The dashboard, being a living database, will be continuously upgraded and improved which will help make RCI information more accessible and its analysis more efficient. She solicited feedback, suggestions, and even requests from participants will help make the dashboard more useful.

Overview of Power BI

Raul Gaitmaitan, CCSD Operations Analyst, gave an overview of Power BI highlighting the basic features and use. Raul emphasized that Power BI allows users to create and adjust visualizations based on individual needs. With Power BI, users will be able to look at data from different perspectives and find insights into data relationships that help make better informed decisions. He mentioned that a real time and life application of Power BI is the RCI Dashboard and the creation of the Climate Change and Sustainable Development Department Dashboard which will be available to staff and management.

Power BI in ADB Projects

Eduardo Angeles, CCRC Consultant, introduced the RCI Dashboard using Power BI noting that it is live and running which is a collection of ten (10) reports focusing on project-level inputs for Operational Priority 7 and uses 60+ measures and over 20 variables in a 21-year time series condensed into responsive and interactive visuals. Unless specified, values in the dashboard correspond to ADB's Financing Commitment, Number of Committed Projects and RCI tagging (with or without RCI component). Its 5 key elements are Filter Pane, Value Switch, Tooltips and Visual Information, Drilldown, and User options (for selected visuals). The dashboard's

primary data sources are eOPS Database and MS Excel from regional departments submitted to RCI. Part of the customization done was to include sub-regional data tagging. More improvements are happening in the coming months.

Moderated Q&A

Aileen Pangilinan, Senior Economics Officer, moderated the session which provided clarifications and additional information:

- Power BI can be access in ADB through the software center; need to request ADB IT support to configure it in your laptop.
- Accurate data is the main considerations to have accurate data generation.
- Updating happens every 4:00 am in order to generate real-time data for the RCI Dashboard.
- It took about 5 months to develop the RCI dashboard for approximately \$50,000.
- It was mentioned that the coverage is past 20 years, how was data analyzed during the ADB shift from counting approvals to commitments in 2017? - We started counting the commitments starting 2017, but prior to that it's all just approvals and then it shifted to commitments. Approvals will be counted as commitments retroactively.
- On the customization, how difficult is it to customize the reports level of user customization in each report of the dashboard is quite extensive.
- How are you updating the current list which I understand came from a one-off submission from the RDs? - The information in the dashboard comes from two sources, eOps and Excel file. The submissions from the RDs are the Excel files, so that's part of some customization that it did for that part of the report. What we're planning is to request from the RD's at least maybe 2 submissions, a middle of the year and then at the end of the year on the approvals.
- Is there a support in ADB that can help develop similar database? A staff can develop our BI database, however, since it takes time to generate and create visuals, consultants may be recruited for support in developing the database.
- Does the database capture any cancellations on project commitments (partial or full)? -The tagging is if the project is cancelled or terminated. No tagging for full or partial termination, so it either terminated, cancelled or active.
- How will the sovops work affect the RCI Dashboard? Sovop will eventually replace eOps. Sovops core team was informed about RCI dashboard development and will be using, so according to them this will all be absorbed under eOps. But what we've done is a good starting ground and all the information will eventually be captured in sovops.
- How are you going to reconcile in the database the project reassignments pre- and post-NOM? - What we will be doing is capturing the processing, the vision and department and also the administering department. We will distinguish between which department is doing the administration and which project is doing the processing, and this will also be available to users.
- There will be a technical manual that can be used as reference should anyone be interested in implementing the process and technical information involved in developing the RCI Dashboard.
- Thank you for a very interesting presentation and answering my questions. May I also share the Education Dashboard that was done in 2017 (Cognos) that is continuously still being updated and improved

Results of the Post-Training Evaluation

The following are the results of the survey conducted from respondents composed of ADB personnel (staff, consultants, contractors):


- How many years have you been working on Regional Cooperation and Integration (RCI): 37.50% for 1-3 years, 25% for those within 7-10 years and 12.50% for those in 10 or more years, and less than 1 year.
- Seventy-five per cent (75%) strongly agreed that the objectives of the training were achieved, and 25% confirmed their agreement. On the statement that their knowledge/skills/understanding in the subject matter increased as a result of this event, 62.50% strongly agreed and 37.50% agreed. Seventy-five percent (75%) of the respondents strongly agreed that they are confident to be able to immediately apply learnings from this event and 25% agreed too. Of the respondents, 62.50% disagree that they DON'T have enough resources to apply or use what I learned from this event, while 12.50% each for those who strongly disagree, agree and strongly agree. Fifty-seven percent (57%) agree that they will recommend this program to their colleagues while 43% strongly agree to do so.
- Respondents specified parts of the program are most useful to their line of work such as developing a user-friendly database, updating and monitoring of the CAREC project portfolio database, how to navigate the Power BI, the visuals that can be generated from the RCI dashboard, and the practical and frank discussion during the Q&A.
- As to where to apply what was learned during the training, the respondents will apply the learning to the sector data, developing similar database, coming up with several reports, accessing information and report creation, and hopes usage of the dashboard for project monitoring so as not to maintain individual excel files.
- All (100%) respondents indicated that duration is just enough, with 71% noting that Resource Persons are well-informed and 86% indicated that topics discussed were relevant.
- The respondents were satisfied with the training as there were no suggestions provided on how to improve the event.


