Gender inequality coupled with climate change crisis is one of the severest challenges in our time. It poses threats to ways of life, livelihoods, health, safety, and security for women and girls around the world. According to United Nations Environment Programme, 80 percent of people displaced by climate change are women and girls, which pushed them to greater risks of economic, physical, and psychological violence. As well, women's unequal participation in decision-making processes and labor force prevents women from fully contributing to climate-related planning, policymaking, and implementation. In parallel, climate change has created risks and uncertainties about our future. Young people are not only victims of climate change, but also contributors to climate actions. We have seen the movement of youths and younger generations across the world to stipulate effective climate change solutions towards achieving sustainable development.
