Hosted by the Government of Fiji and the Asian Development Bank, in partnership with Australian Government and the World Bank, , with support from the Pacific Islands Forum Secretariat, Pacific Regional Infrastructure Facility, New Zealand Government, United States Government, the Government of Japan, European Union and European Investment Bank. This flagship in-person event brings business community together with key representatives from Pacific governments and development partners to discuss the infrastructure development priorities for the Pacific region, especially growing opportunities in Transport, Energy, Water, ICT, Social (Health and Education) Infrastructure Sectors.
