Promoting Plastics Circularity in the Philippines: Launch of the Manila City Action Plan for Plastic Circularity and Future Opportunities

Background

The Philippines is among the top contributors of marine plastic pollution, accounting for 36% of ocean plastic inputs. The Pasig River, a major waterway traversing the capital region of Metro Manila, is among the top river basins contributing to 90% of land-based leakages of plastic waste into the ocean. This has major impacts on the health of communities and the natural environment, as plastic waste clogs riverine, coastal, and marine ecosystems and permeates food systems.

The Asian Development Bank (ADB) is supporting the Philippines in the implementation of its National Plan of Action for the Prevention, Reduction, and Management of Marine Litter (NPOA-ML). To strengthen local level capacity and implementation, ADB supported preparation of a city action plan to promote plastics circularity in the city of Manila. The city action plan aims to address the gaps in the formal waste management system, while capturing the opportunities that can be achieved through collaboration with various actors in the plastics value chain to promote plastics circularity.

The launch of the city action plan contributes to ADB's holistic and system-wide approach for supporting the NPOA-ML and operationalizing plastics circularity in Manila and beyond. ADB recently launched a program supporting Pasig River rehabilitation, starting with the Pasig River Discovery Space to develop a digital twin model for plastic pollution. This complements a Blue Loan to Indorama Ventures Ltd to expand plastics recycling capacity in the Philippines in 2020 and the preparation of a proposed policy-based loan to support blue economy development. The launch presents a key opportunity for a dialogue between ADB and the Government of the Philippines for continued collaboration to address plastic pollution and transition to a circular economy.

- To formally hand over and launch the City Action Plan for Plastic Circularity to the City of Manila
- To engage in a dialogue with stakeholders from the Government of the Philippines on future opportunities to operationalize plastics circularity in Manila and beyond
