In the early 2000s, she joined the Quality Assurance Department of PhilHealth, where she focused on health technology assessment. clinical practice guidelines. standards development for quality improvement in healthcare, and projects that studied healthcare providers' practices and prescribing behaviors. With over 20 years of experience in the National Health Insurance Program, Mel has spearheaded the building block initiatives for developing and costing benefit packages for catastrophic conditions and negotiation and contracting processes. Currently, her work centers on health systems management focused on healthcare financing, leading efforts to expand PhilHealth's coverage for high-burden and catastrophic conditions to improve financial risk protection and achieve universal health coverage



Eduardo Banzon, Asian Development Bank

He is the Director of ADB's Human and Social Development Sectors Office who champions Universal Health Coverage and has long provided technical support to countries in Asia and the Pacific in their pursuit of this goal. Before joining ADB in 2014, he was President and CEO of the Philippine Health Insurance Corporation, World Health Organization (WHO) regional adviser for health financing for the Eastern Mediterranean region and WHO health economist in Bangladesh, and World Bank senior health specialist for the East Asia and Pacific region. He was also a faculty member of the University of the Philippines' College of Medicine and Ateneo Graduate School of Business and was an honorary visiting associate professor at the National University of Singapore Saw Swee Hock School of Public Health.
