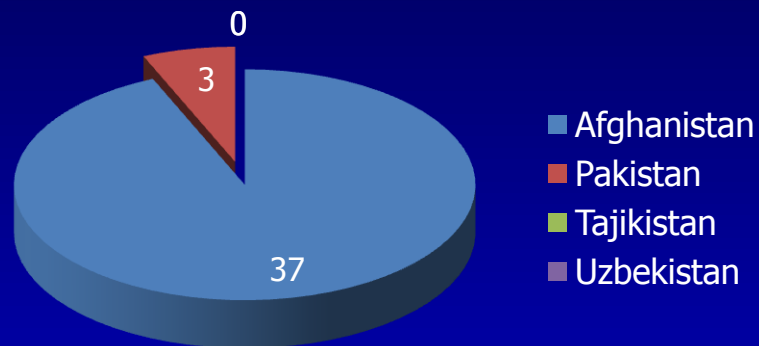

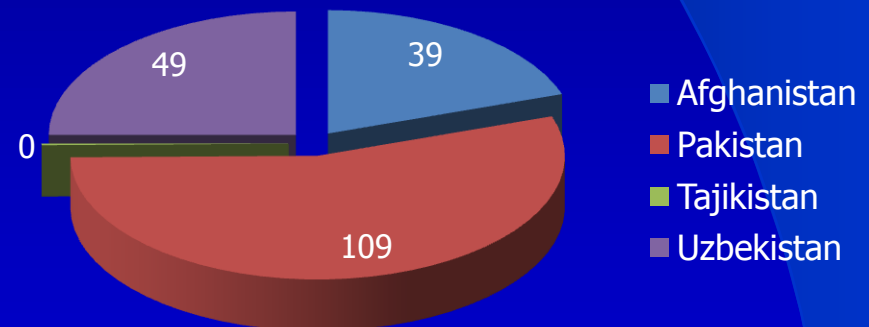

**\$40 million**

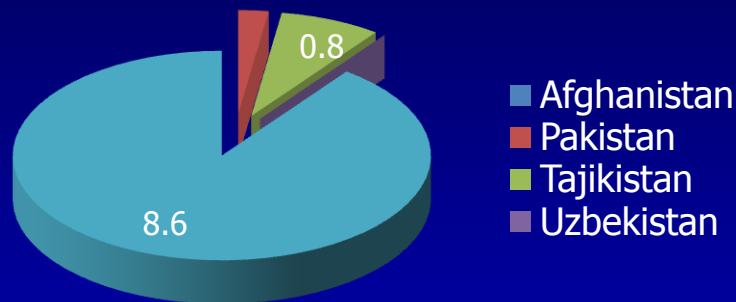


**Civil works etc, 2011**

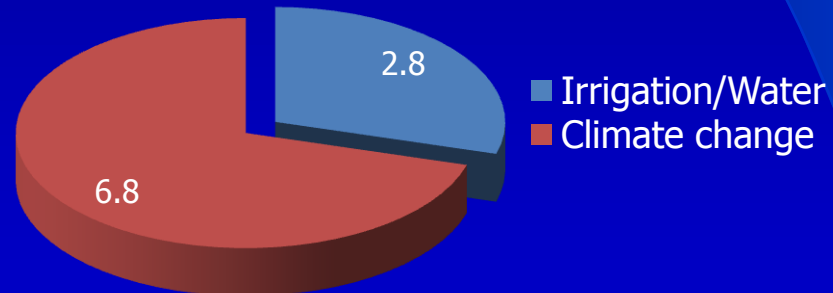

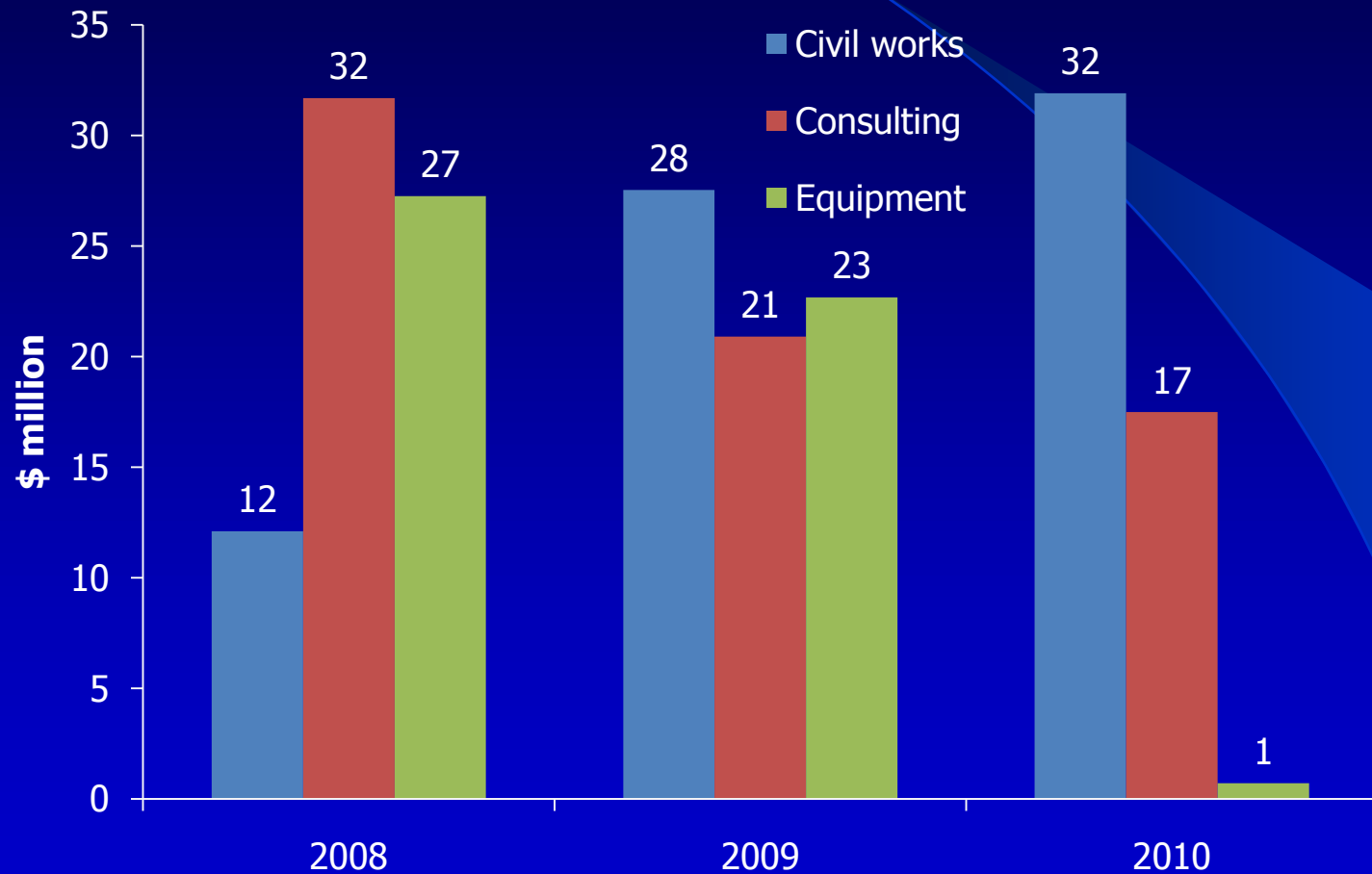
