- Philippines
- Viet Nam
- Cambodia
- Lao PDR



Education and Training Sector Strategies

SERD countries are varied:

- lower middle-income (Indonesia and the Philippines)
- low income (Viet Nam)
- less developed (Cambodia and Lao PDR).



Education and Training Sector Strategies

- Education and training strategies vary according to country needs and objectives.
- General trend: early focus on primary education in the poorer countries, moving to the secondary level, and with growing emphasis on technical and vocational education and training (TVET), and higher education

Indonesia - Context

- Ranked in bottom third of global competitiveness index
- High unemployment compared with neighbors
- Loss of formal sector jobs with most growth in informal sector and SMEs
- Provincial SME development limited by shortage of good quality graduates
- Opportunities for overseas work increasing



Indonesia - Education

- Good progress in getting children into school
- Almost 100% participation in primary education and 75% of children in lower secondary education
- Gender parity
- Rural-urban disparities despite significant efforts to reduce them
- Low relevance of vocational schools and polytechnics



Indonesia – Recent Developments

- Decentralization of education to districts
- Substantial increases in education budget
- Successful in enrolling children in hard-toreach areas but enrolments at secondary level now stagnating
- Expected to reach the MDG for universal primary education by 2015
- New programs to support universal participation in basic education (9 years) by defraying costs for parents

Indonesia – ADB Strategy

- help in achieving better quality, relevance and competitiveness at all levels, including vocational and higher education
- foster good governance and accountability in public and private schools as well as madrasah

- Higher Education Development 2012



Philippines - Context

- Continued rapid population growth
- Economic growth average real GDP growth >5% per year during 2002-10, but ...
- Poverty stagnant/worsening (24.9% of pop. in 2003, increasing to 26.5% in 2009)
- MDGs for primary education, underweight children and maternal mortality also off-track
- Persistent high levels of un- and underemployment, despite good GDP growth (7% and 19% in 2010 despite 7.3% GDP growth)

Philippines – Education

- Enrolment and completion rates stagnant or falling, especially in secondary education
- Large disparities across regions and socioeconomic levels
- Limited opportunities for high quality middlelevel skills training
- Proliferation of low quality higher education institutions
- Persistent underfinancing of education compared with population growth



Philippines – Recent Developments

- Current 10-year basic education cycle to be extended to 12 years in line with international practice
- Kindergarten to be included as part of basic education
- No comprehensive reform plan yet for TVET or higher education



Philippines – ADB Strategy

- No ADB education projects in the Philippines apart from one TA-funded partnership with an NGO to provide on-line teacher training
- Now beginning to explore options for assistance in expansion to 12 year education cycle and higher education reform, focusing on use of public-private partnerships.



Viet Nam - Context

- Intends to become an industrialized country by 2020
- Requires rapid changes in the economy and social development
- Government strategy is to promote rapid human resource development to meet labor needs in a competitive market economy.



Viet Nam - Education

- Good progress overall
- Universal primary education and high enrolments in lower secondary education
- Equity and quality are significant issues
- Vocational training system not responsive to labor market needs.
- Higher education needs to be modernized.



Viet Nam – Recent Developments

- Government has expanded universal enrolment in basic education to 9 years
- Aiming for universal enrolment in upper secondary by 2015
- Recent strong focus on expansion of TVET and improving quality of HE especially in science and technology



Viet Nam - ADB Strategy

- Focus is post-basic education: upper secondary education, TVET and higher education
- Policy reform at secondary level through a program approach
- Addressing key skills shortages through new college-level vocational training
- Catalysing university reform by supporting a model university with more flexibility and funding.



Viet Nam – New Projects

- Skills Enhancement Project. Approved 2010 and effective February 2011
- New Model University Project, 2011
- Second Upper Secondary Education Development Project, 2012
- Skills Enhancement Project II, 2013
- Lower Secondary Education for Coastal Provinces, 2013

Cambodia - Context

- Solidifying achievements after recovery from a post-conflict situation
- Government is enhancing economic growth, employment, equity and social justice
- training for poverty reduction and development
- Poverty falling, but inequality increasing
- Limited industrial base and employment opportunities



Cambodia – Education

- Near universal primary school coverage, but lower coverage at secondary level
- MDG for universal primary education achieved but not for 9 years basic education
- Poor education quality and high dropout rates
- Shallow human resource base with few skilled workers
- Large numbers of out-of-school and unemployed youth



Cambodia – Recent Developments

- New Education Law promulgated in 2007
- Plan for rationalizing deployment of teachers
- New national curriculum policy
- Decentralization of school management
- Upgrading and expansion of skills development system



Cambodia – ADB Strategy

- Reform and investment in basic and secondary education through a series of education sector development projects, to improve sector funding and improve access and quality
- Development of formal vocational education to supply skilled workers
- Expansion of nonformal skills training to increase incomes and quality of life for rural dwellers

- Third Education Sector Development Program, 2011
- Strengthening TVET II, 2013
- Fourth Education Sector Development Program, 2013



Lao PDR - Context

- One of the poorest countries in ASEAN
- Strong economic growth in recent years has led to significant reduction in poverty
- Dependent on external assistance
- Limited financial and human absorptive capacity
- Very low government spending on education, though some increase in recent years



Lao - Education

- Demand for education strong
- Rapid rise in primary enrolment rate (93%), but lower at other levels: 60% and 34% in lower and upper secondary, 5-10% at tertiary level
- Gender disparities are marked
- Broader access, better quality and higher efficiency needed
- Skill shortages due to economic growth in some sectors and weak linkages between education and the labor market



Lao – Recent Developments

- Education has expanded rapidly as secondary and higher levels must absorb rising number of primary graduates
- Gender disparities decreasing
- Education Sector Development Framework (ESDF) approved by Government in 2009



Lao — ADB Strategy

- ADB a lead donor in Lao education
- ESDF a unifying umbrella for government and donor education sector development work
- Supporting secondary education curriculum reform, starting SY2010/11
- Recent support to TVET and higher education to strengthen human resource base
- Policy and project interventions to support expanded access, quality/relevance, and sector governance

- Secondary Education Sector Improvement Project, 2013
- Strengthening Higher Education Project II, 2014
