Civil Society Participation at ADB

- Over 90% of ADB projects have some form of civil society participation
- •From planning and design consultations through the project cycle to project implementation, CSO participation is taken full advantage of = more effective and sustainable efforts.







Youth and Water

- •Asia Pacific's children and youth are especially vulnerable amidst cross-cutting water issues.
- •Many young girls spend their days fetching water instead of going to school or in more value-generating work.







Youth and Water

Water?

- The region is home to the biggest proportion of unemployed youth (36.4 million) and youth who are working poor (152 million), majority of whom work in agriculture.
- Thousands of children die each day of waterborne diseases due to unsafe water and lack of basic sanitation facilities.











Our Project Timeline...





Empower people, Advance projects & Secure water for the communities through Youth initiatives and advocacies.




