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
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What is "Inclusive"?



"Inclusive" urban infrastructure development is defined as an integrated approach encompassing sustainable, resilient and affordable solutions to the challenges faced by the urban poor and vulnerable groups by enhancing their access to urban services and infrastructure through targeted investments.

Figure 3: CRITICAL ASPECTS OF INCLUSIVE URBAN DEVELOPMENT

Inclusive Cities – definition

A city is **Inclusive** when there is **equitable** and **affordable** access to urban infrastructure, land, housing, social services and livelihood opportunities. Urban infrastructure includes water supply, sanitation, solid waste management, urban access roads and transport facilities, services are typically health and education.

The inclusive city is built on joint strategic visions through a participatory planning and decision-making process shared between government, communities, civil society, and private sector. It offers adequate social protection for its constituents (systems for upholding children and juvenile, women, and indigenous peoples' rights), and resilient to environmental challenges (climate change and disaster vulnerabilities).

Figure 2: DIMENSIONS OF URBAN POVERTY




Figure 4: INCLUSIVE URBAN REDEVELOPMENT APPROACH




Figure 4: INCLUSIVE URBAN REDEVELOPMENT APPROACH





Figure 1: PROCESS FLOW FOR INTEGRATED URBAN DEVELOPMENT ASSESSMENTS

Figure 8: SECTOR ASSESSMENTS AND OPTIONS




Figure 9: APPROACH TO CROSS SECTORAL PRIORITIZATION AND PROJECT PROGRAMMING




Figure 5: PROCESS FLOWCHART: POLICY AND PLANNING COMPONENT
