A quick overview of CCTs...

- Poverty-targeted social assistance that encourages human capital investments
- Regular cash benefits to poor families with kids
- Conditions:
 - School enrollment & attendance
 - Regular health center visits
 - Monthly family development sessions
- Goal: healthier and better educated kids grow up to get better jobs

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How much do families get per month?

P 500 for health

P 300 for education (elementary)

P 500 for education (high school)

P 500 minimum (no school kids)

P 2,000 maximum (3 HS kids)

2015 average: P 941 per month

2015 poverty line: P 9,140 per month

(for a family of 5)



Pantawid Pamilya in numbers, 2015

- \$1.2 billion annual budget
- 4.38 million households
- 10+ million children
- 120,000 parent leaders
- 13,000+ DSWD staff & field workers
- 1.44 million family development sessions



Is the program working?

- Yes!
- Compliance verification system
- Independent spot checks
- Grievance redress system
- Listahanan round 2
- Impact evaluation



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- More spending on health & education
- Near universal elementary enrolment
- Higher high school enrolment
- More pre- and post-natal care and delivery in health facilities
- Child labor reduced by an average of 7 days per month
- Grants do not cause dependency
- Pantawid households don't spend more on vices
- Lower self-rated poverty
- More optimism about the future
- Reduced conflict & insurgent influence
