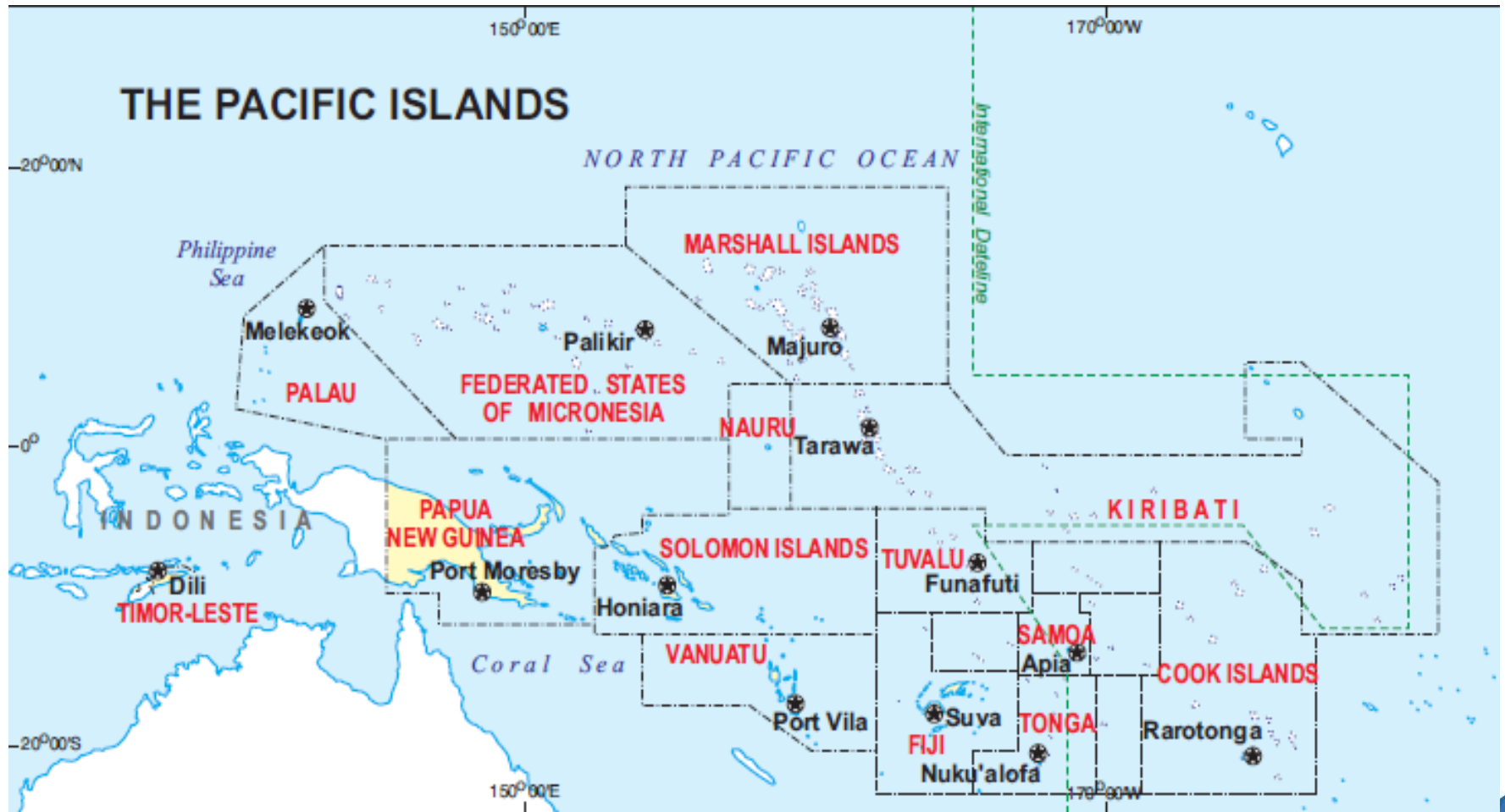

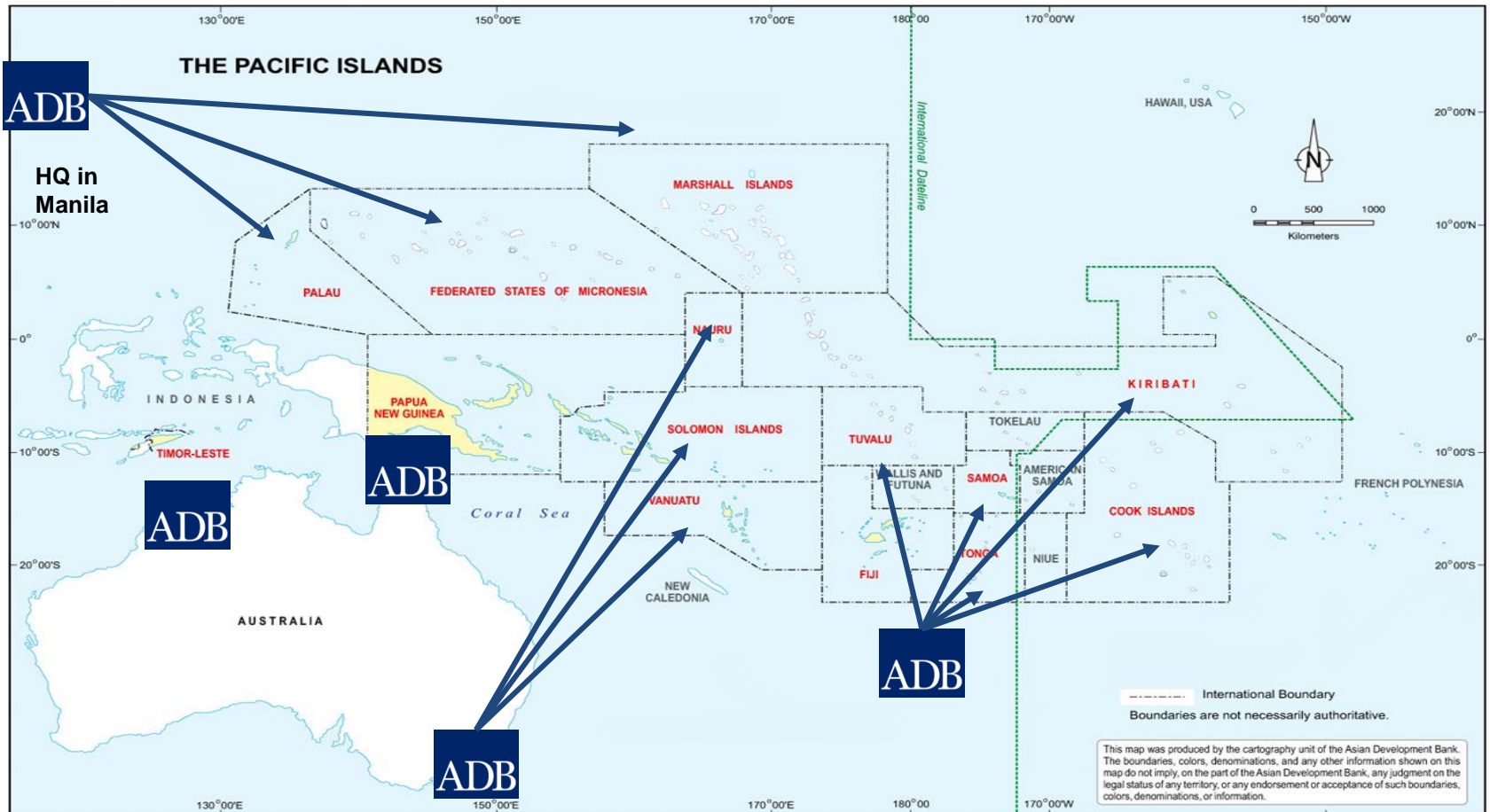

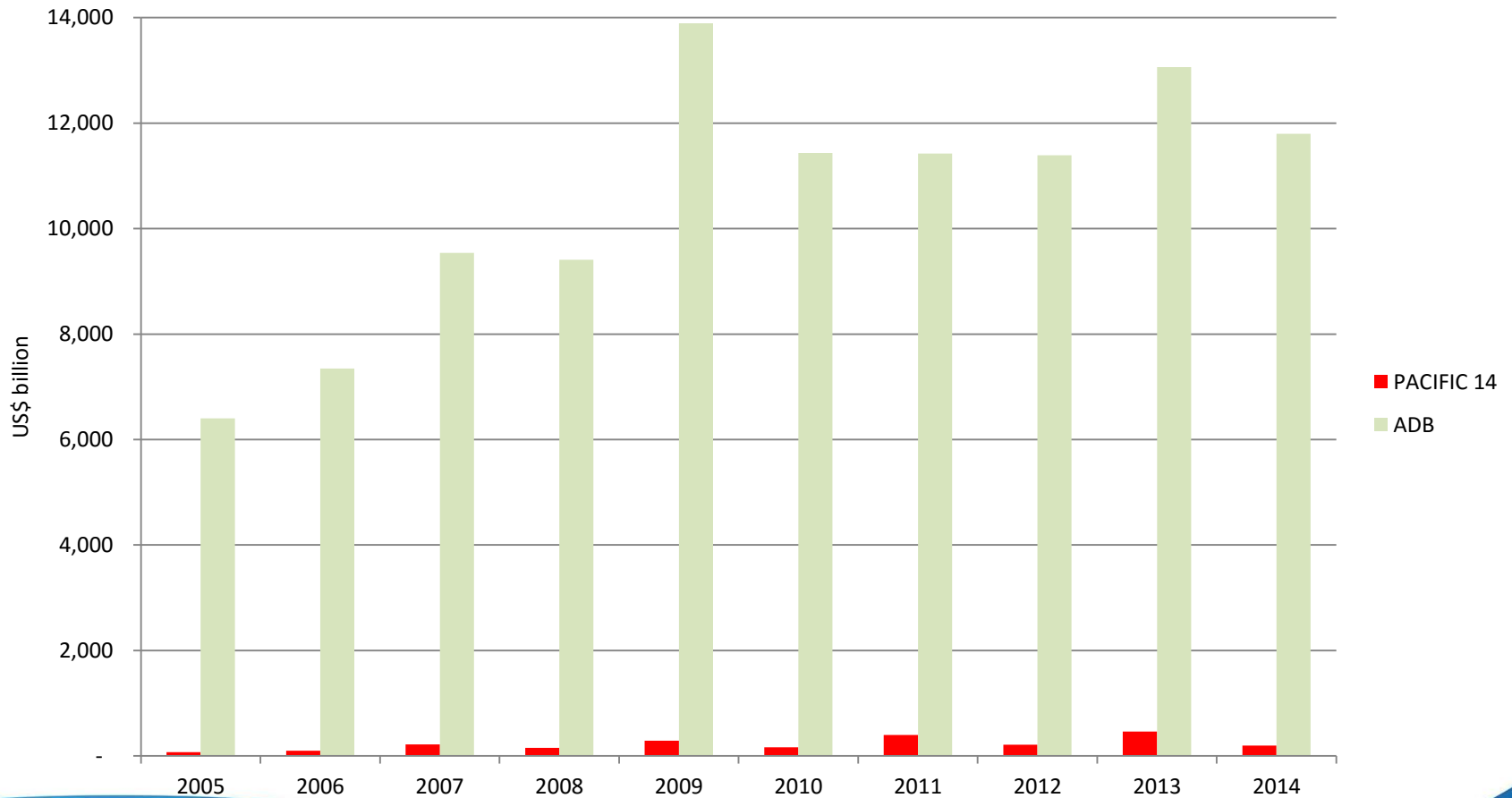


ADB offices in the Pacific

(1-3% of ADB Total Loan/Grant Approval)

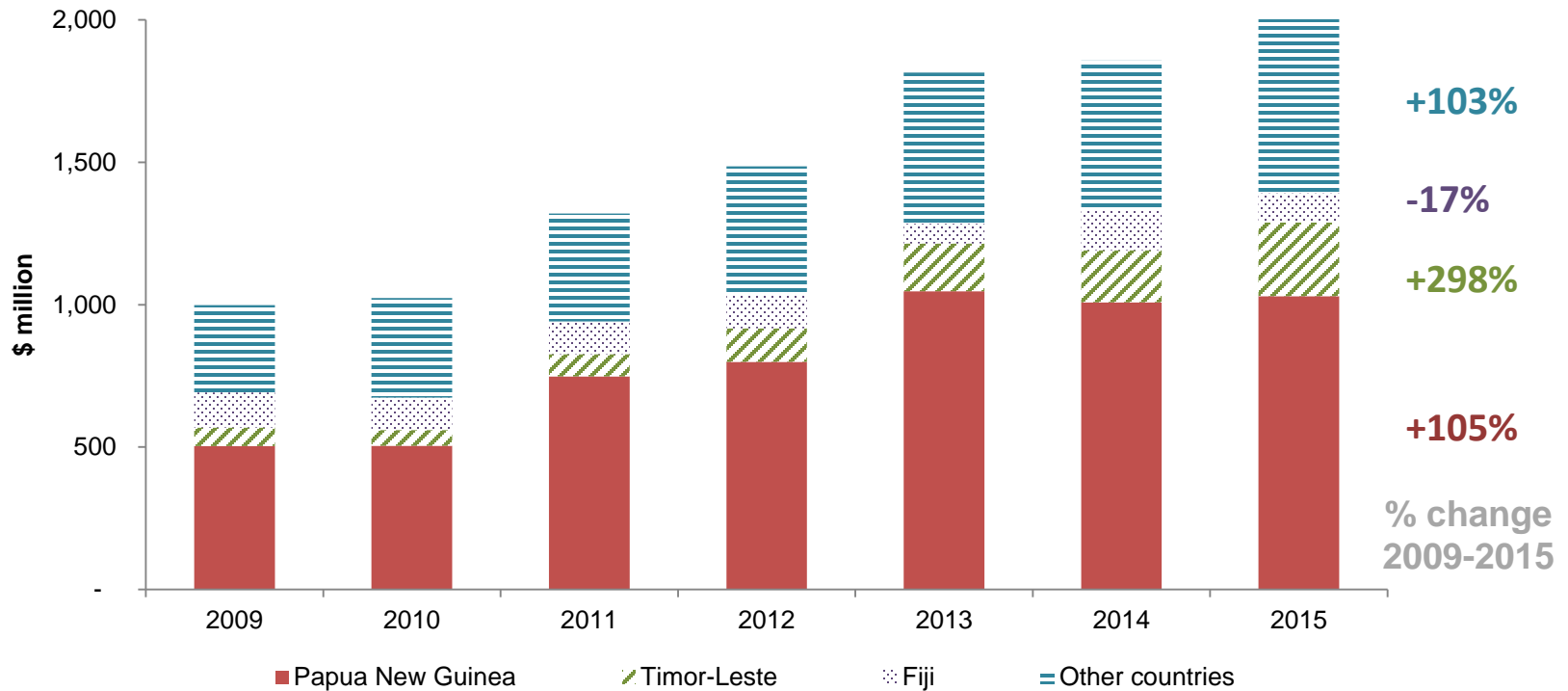

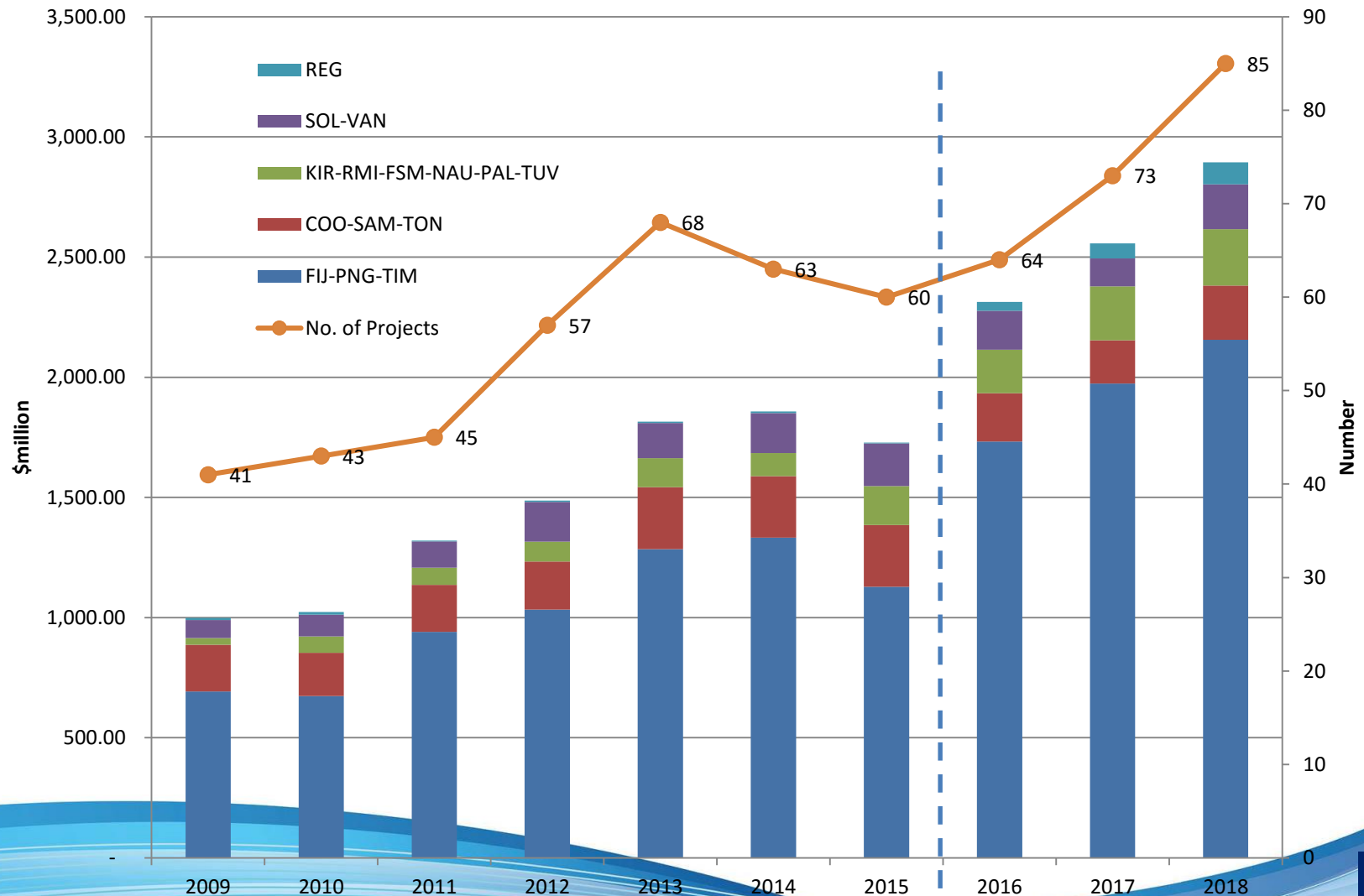

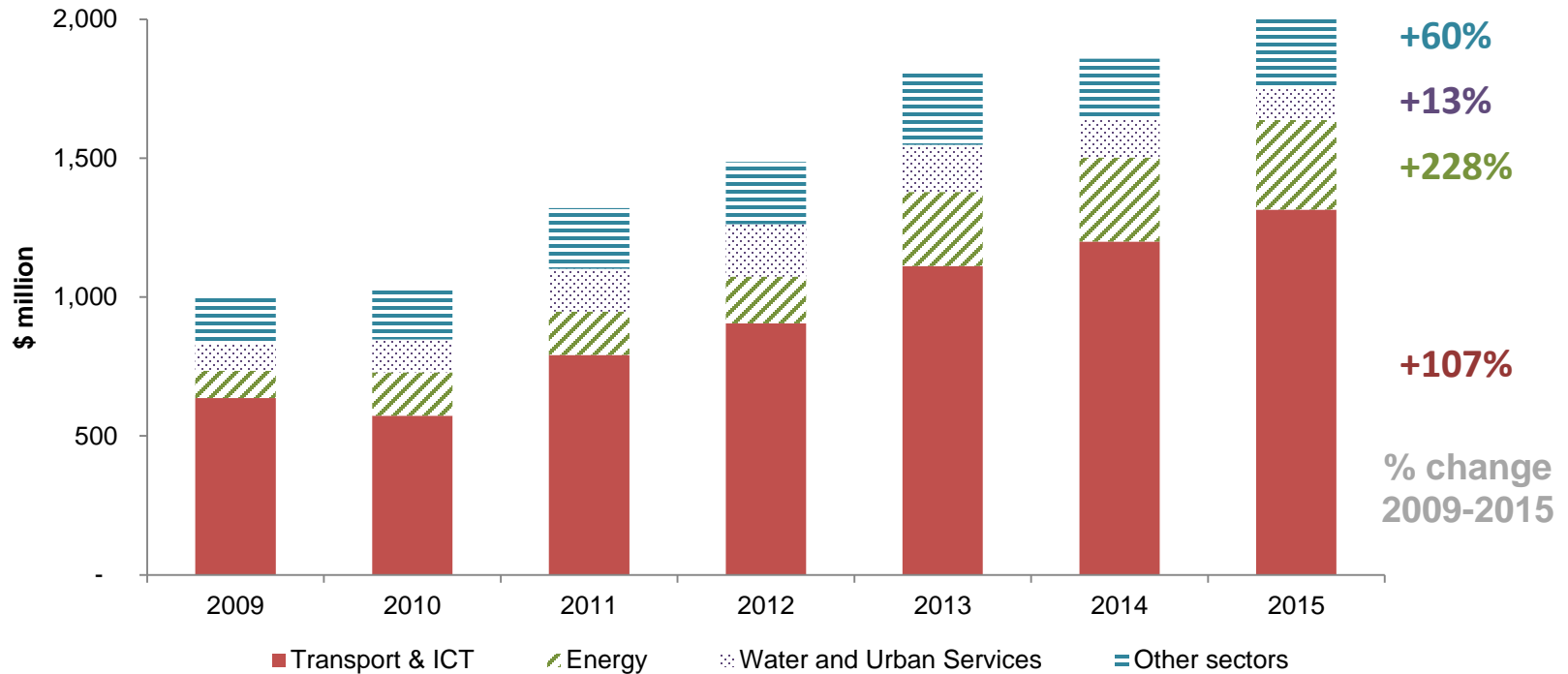

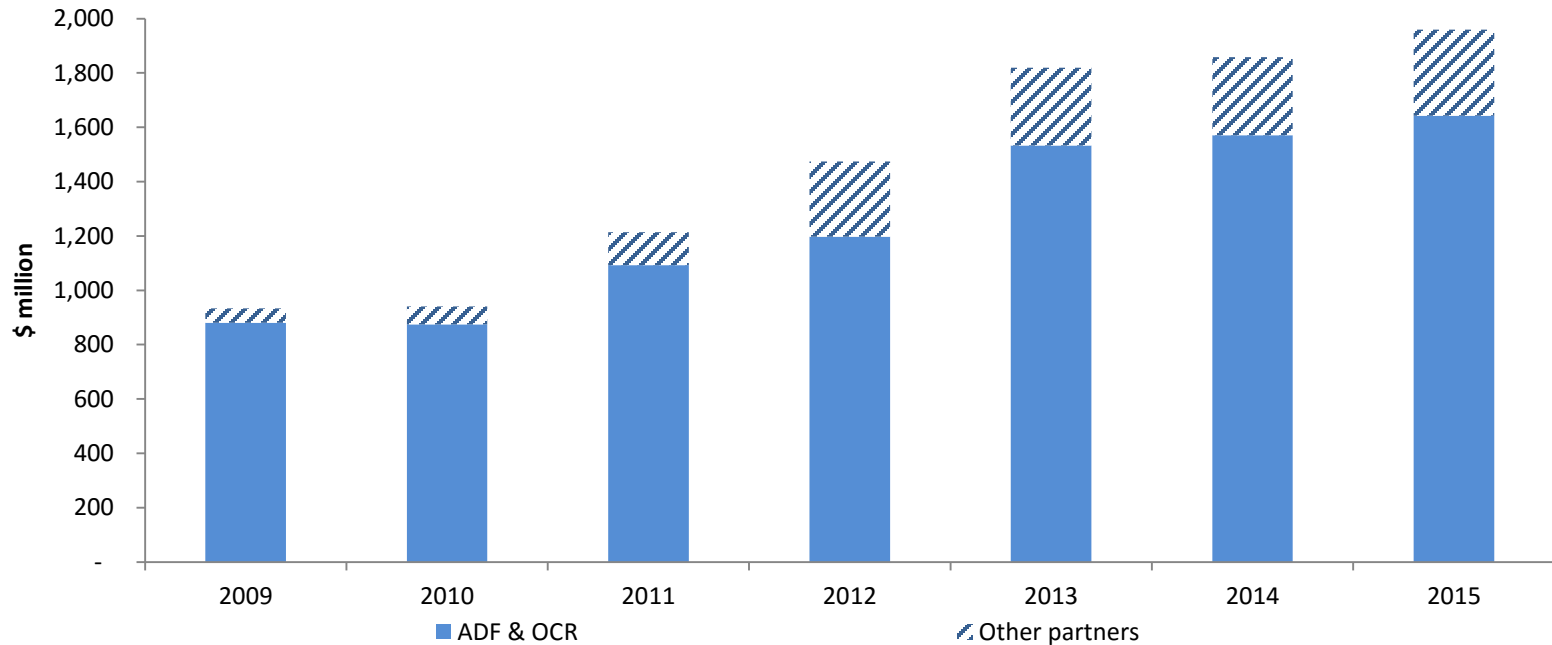

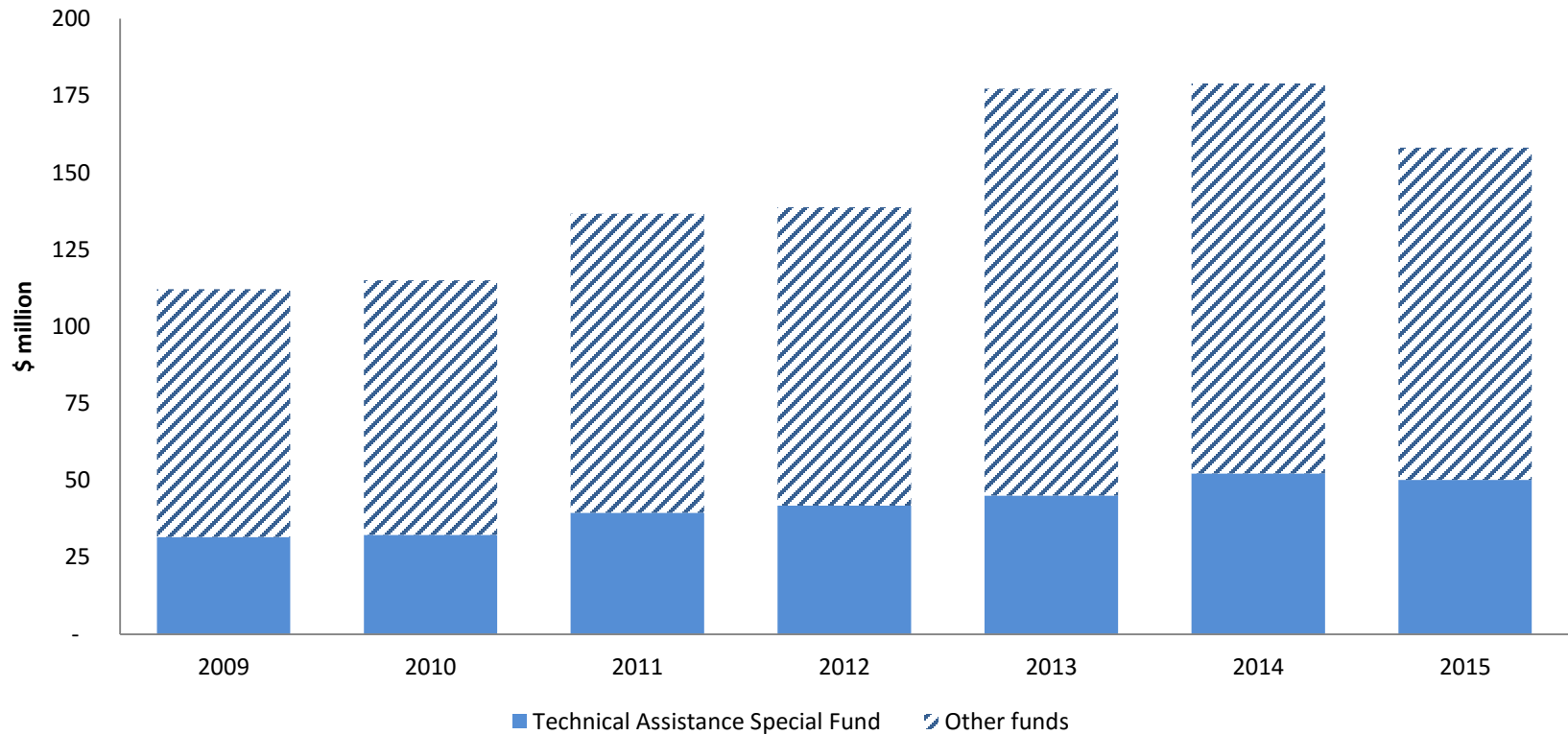

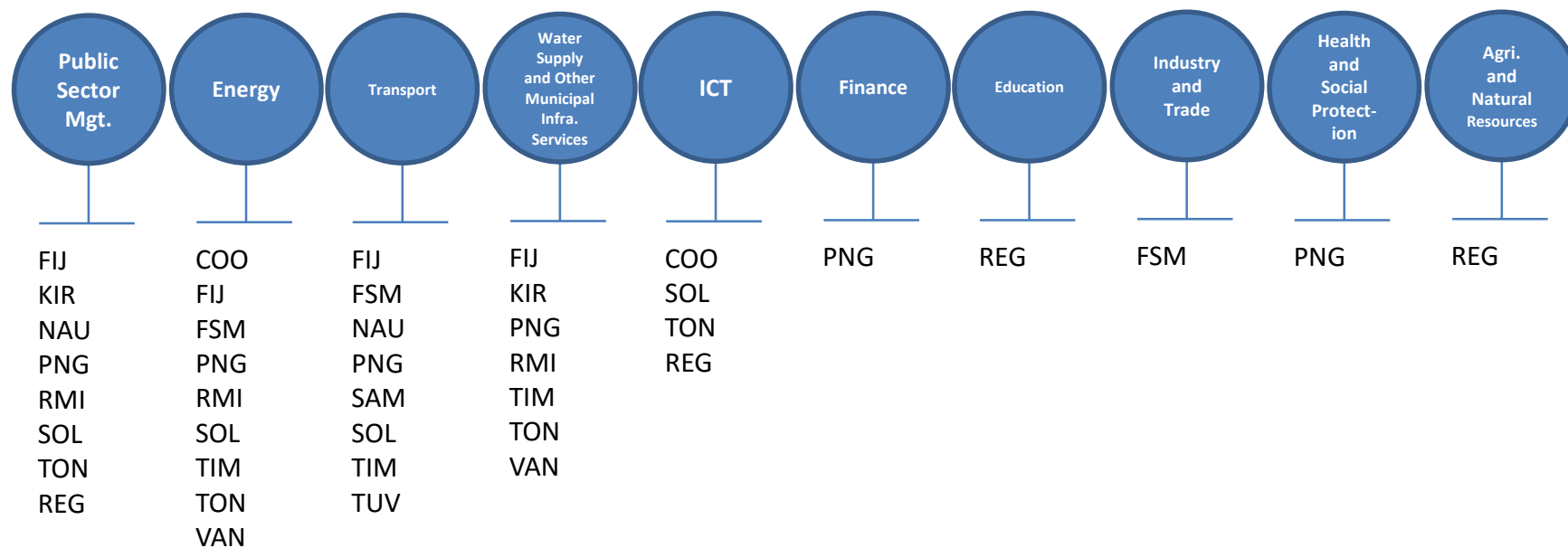


Strengthened Partnerships:

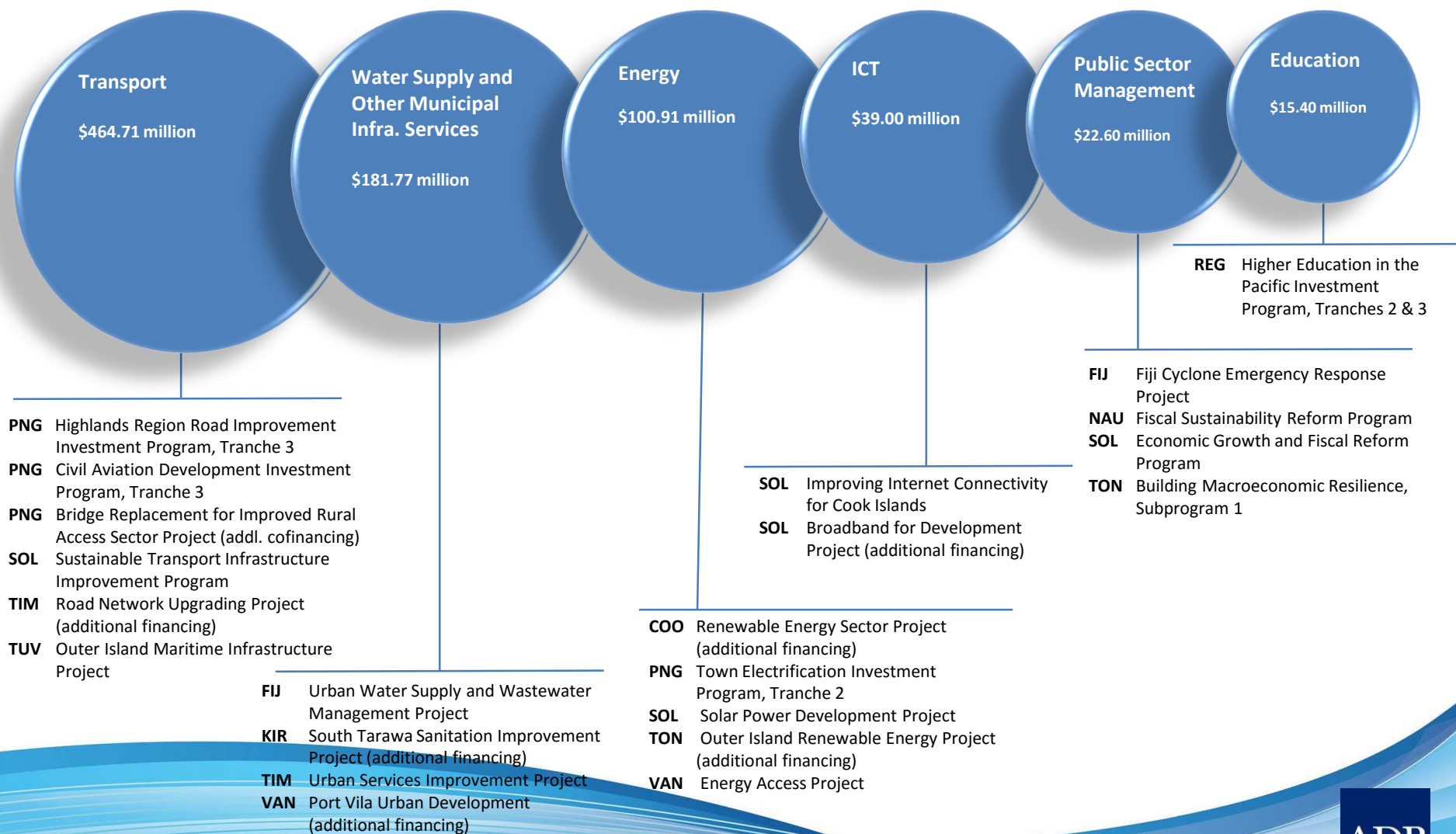

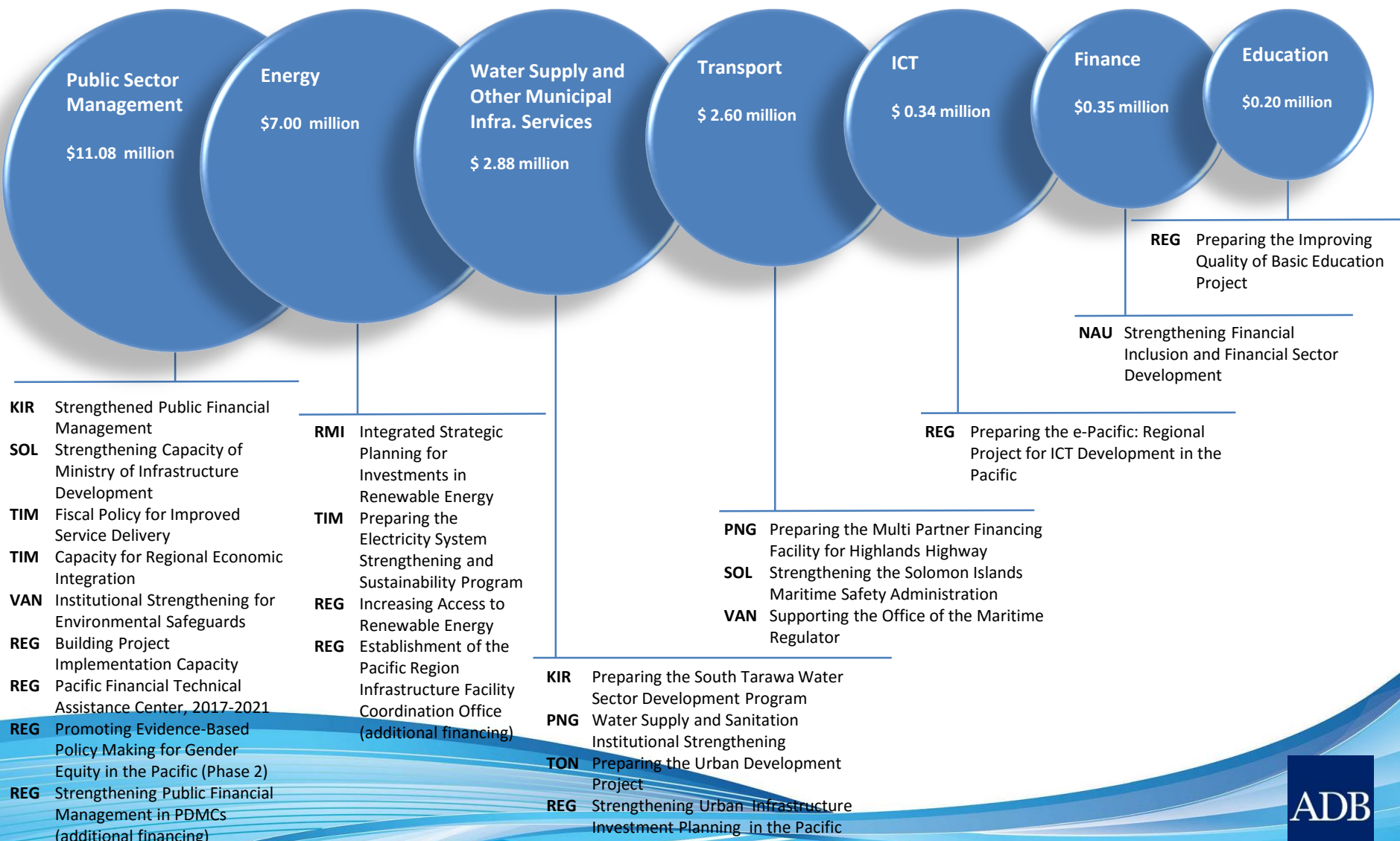
