


Help developing member countries improve development results by...

On PSM Reforms

Support DMCs
(particularly those in transition) in partnership with the private sector and in innovative ways

PSM (2015: 11.7% of total ADB operations) *(for 2012-*

2015: 13%)

GCD as a theme in total ADB operations (2015): 80% (2012-2015: 64%)

On Governance Risks

Ensure ADB's investments account for governance risks, including in emergent areas such as climate change

On Capacity Development

Ensure a broader focus on institutional performance in DMCs in support of, and in tandem with, ADB's investments



For the medium-term, the Governance & PSM pipeline and work looks like this...


PSM Investments, 2014-2018







3	Joint work on	ADB and the local institution will collaborate to: (a)reconceptualize capacity development approaches (b)jointly design and deliver programs (c)pool expertise and experience to develop relevant case study materials for use in skills development programs; and (d)carry out practice-based research on governance and PSM						
4	Use of local institutions as a	Wherever possible, ADB will encourage the use of local institutions as a learning hub on Governance and PSM (also to maximize						

proximity to ADB HQ, and the various field-based locations)
