THE LAW

LAW NUMBER 2 YEAR 2012 ON "LAND ACQUISITION FOR THE DEVELOPMENT OF PUBLIC INTERESTS":

- WAS ENACTED ON 14 JANUARY 2012
- FOR ONGOING PROJECTS (THE RESTS OF UNFINISHED LAND PROCUREMENTS)
 WERE TAKEN FULLY INTO EFFECTS SINCE 01 JANUARY 2016

PUBLIC INTEREST IS THE NATION,
THE STATE, THE PEOPLE
INTERESTS THOSE ARE
ACCOMPLISHED BY THE
GOVERNMENT AND USED FOR
THE MOST PROSPERITY OF THE
PEOPLE, THE NATION, AND THE
STATE



BASIC PRINCIPLES

SHALL BE IN ACCORDANCE WITH:

- 1. NATIONAL SPATIAL PLANNING
- 2. REGIONAL DEVELOPMENT PLANNING
- 3. INSTITUTION STRATEGIC PLAN
- 4. WORK PLAN OF EACH GOVERNMENT INSTITUTION

SHALL BE:

- 1. IN BALANCE BETWEEN THE DEVELOPMENT INTERESTS AND THE PEOPLE INTERESTS
- 2. FAIR AND JUSTICE IN DELIVERING THE COMPENSATIONS

4 (FOUR) PHASES OF LAND ACQUISITION:

- 1. PLANNING
- 2. PREPARATION
- 3. IMPLEMENTATION
- 4. DELIVERY





PLANNING

Planning Document, consists of i.e. Environmental Impacts Analysis, Cost and Benefit Analysis, Numbers of Parcels and Owners and Occupants, Estimation of the Compensation Values



PREPARATION (90 – 208 days)

- 1. Public Consultation: All the Land Owner Must Agree
- 2. Site Plan Decree: by Governor or Mayor/Regent



IMPLEMENTATION (104 – 210 days)

- 1. Technical and Juridical Data Collection (44 days)
- 2. Valuation of Compensation (30 days)
- 3. Arrangement of Compensation Agreement (30 days)
- 4. Payment of Compensation





HIGHLIGHT LESSONS

Comparing to Old Regulations (Presidential Regulation No. 65 of 2006)

- 1. Certain Time Frames → Faster Land Procurements
- 2. Better Compensation Values → Among + 8,000 Values in 2015: Less Than 0.6 % Appeals
- 3. Higher Public Participations → Among 384 Public Interest Projects in 2015 Only 3 Appeals the Site Plan Decrees and Its All Won by the Government



CHALLENGES

- 1. High Demands for More Public Interest Infrastructures → Less Available Lands
- 2. Concentration of Populations in Certain Areas Like Urban, Semi Urban and Coastal Areas
- 3. The State Auditors and Authorities Still Have a Different Paradigm Towards the Value of the Compensations (Tax Value versus Market Value) → Have Impacts to Accountability



OPPORTUNITIES

- 1. de-Bureaucratic and de-Regulation of Investment and Infrastructure Projects Arrangements
- 2. More Investors to Come and to Join the Projects
