

What is Ecolabel?

- An ecolabel identifies a product that meets a wide range of environmental performance criteria or standards.
- Developed by governments, manufacturers, and thirdcompany organizations, ecolabeling is a voluntary approach to environmental certification practiced around the world.
- In contrast to "green" symbols or claims, an ecolabel is given to products that have met specific environmental criteria.

By now the Ecolabel Index lists 431 ecolabels in 246 countries and across 25 industries.





Confusion to consumers, nightmare to manufacturers




- More than 400 eco-labeling schemes in operation globally covering everything from lumber to fish, tea to textiles and tourism

Managers' evaluation of challenges in ecolabeling



Perception of the level of pressure from different stakeholder groups





ISO 14001 - Worldwide total





ISO 50001- Worldwide total





ISO 14001 - Worldwide total




