






Range of Tools and Approaches in our Region

Objective

Identify, document and communicate P-E-C mainstreaming tools, and achievements and contributions in pro-poor environmentally sustainable outcomes.





Users will gain knowledge and perspectives from the application of P-E-C mainstreaming tools that promote and guide an integrated, and balanced, approach for poverty reduction, gender equality, economic growth, and environmental sustainability including climate change adaptation and mitigation.

In addition, the Compendium will also enable an analysis of how P-E-C tools have contributed towards results covering specific SDG and targets

Key takeaways from the Narrative:

- Integration into Planning: policy reviews, encouraging multi-sectoral participation, provision of evidence, establishing a central framework for integration and linking national plans to subnational plans, building capacity and guidelines at the local level
- ◆ Investments: (Public)- setting baselines of public spending, tracking budgets, assessment and advocating for legislative change to improve revenue-sharing, influencing performance criteria for intergovernmental fiscal transfers, improving data management, undertaking cost benefit analyses; (Private)- whole of cycle approach
- Institutions: capacity building, cross-sectoral coordination, multistakeholder participation
- ◆ Information: M&E frameworks, application of SEEA

Identify and communicate mainstreaming result pathways

Narrative materials will be produced which aim to cover the following:

- Link P-E-C mainstreaming tools with four <u>result</u> areas:
 - 1) Integrated policies (programmes, plans, strategies and laws);
 - 2) Institutions (organizational capacity development);
 - 3) Information (data and monitoring for P-E-C by national systems); and,
 - 4) Investments (level of public and private investment or systems for improving pro-poor environmental sustainability)
- ➤ Progression over time of P-E-C mainstreaming gains in terms of macroeconomic plans, sector strategies and plans, monitoring processes, financing and implementation at sub-national levels.
- > The institutional changes and progression to adopt and apply mainstreaming approaches and tools, largely from substantive engagement in development planning and implementation processes, and capacity building and learning.
- > The interconnectedness of P-E-C mainstreaming tools where outputs from one tool feed into and inform the application of other p-e-c mainstreaming tools
