

Good jobs, decent income, increased productivity, better competitiveness and knowledge based economy



#### Where we are now


- Education lending is gradually growing, reflecting growing demand
- Current process is not sufficiently incentivizing innovations
- Current educational practice in many DMCs lags behind
- Technology provides huge opportunities to transform but the use in our projects has been too slow

#### Where we want to go


- Funding alone is inadequate. Finance






