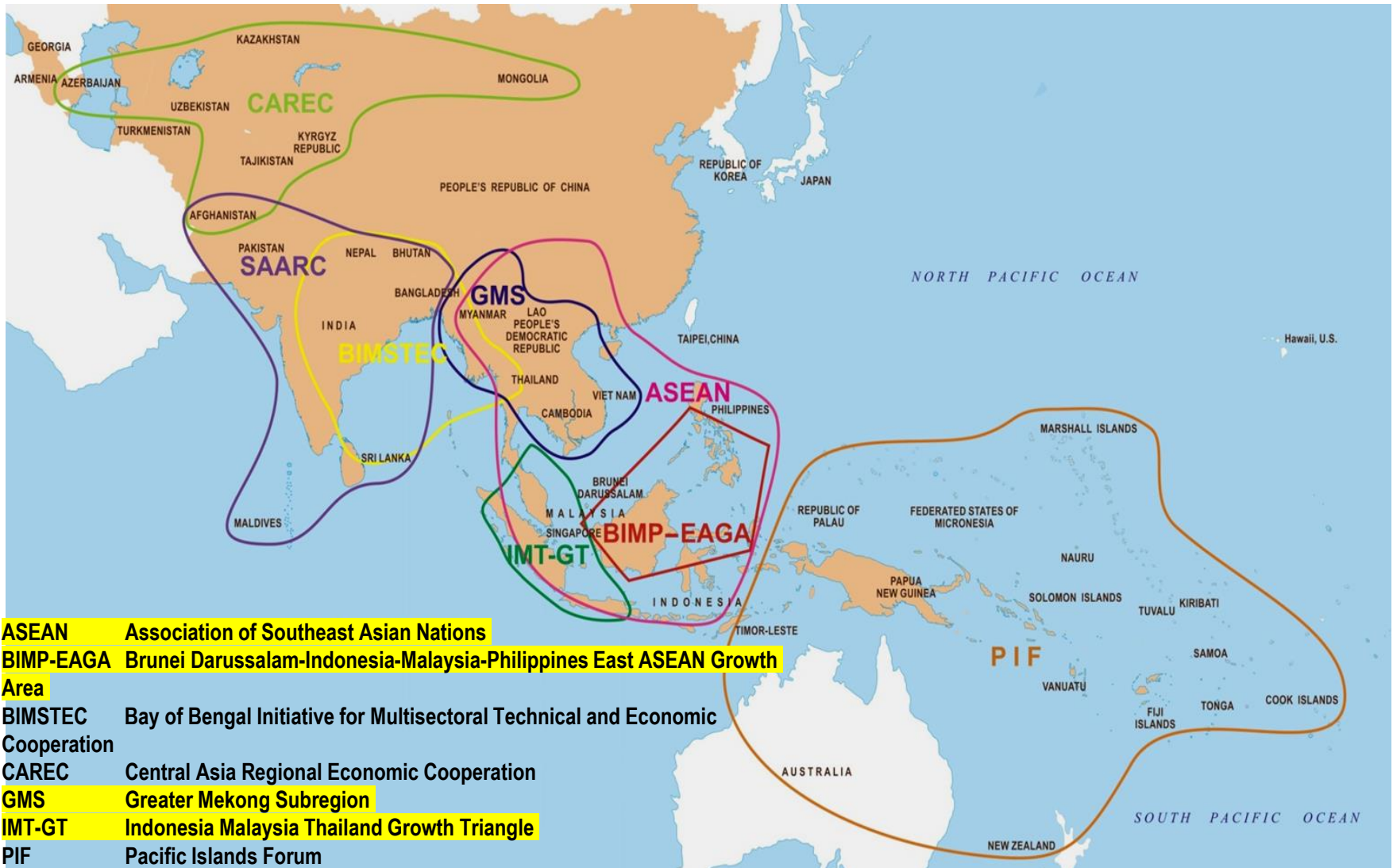

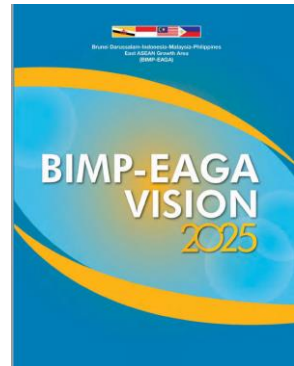
Regional Cooperation and Integration: Subregional Groupings in Southeast Asia



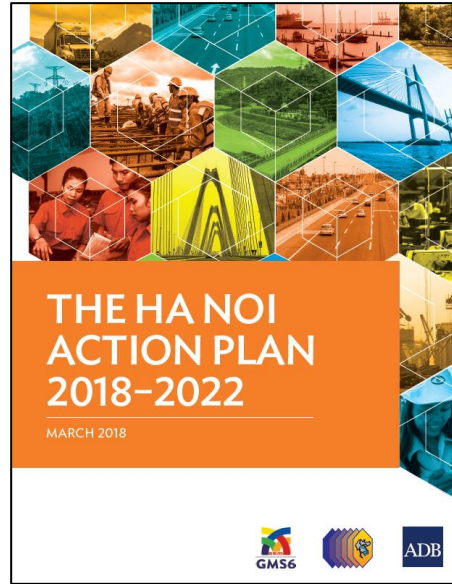

	Mae Sot-Myawaddy Border Crossing Project and Infrastructure Improvements (with Thailand)	Border-crossing facilities	The project involves a new bypass road and bridge to the north of the existing border crossing at Mae Sot (Thailand)-Myawaddy (Myanmar), which is in the congested area between the two cities. This new crossing will be dedicated to cross-border freight traffic. The bypass will link up with a newly envisioned special trade zone in Myanmar.
