How did it all started?

- Early adopters of eGP in the region (Korea, Malaysia, Philippines)
- ADB as a founding member of MDB eGP working group
- Early eGP assessments
- Guidance documents produced by MDB eGP working group
- Cautious approach – “you cannot totally trust technology” (parallel use of paper and eGP)
- 2011 – ADB conducted eGP survey - 27 countries participated
- 2011 – Procurement conference focused on eGP (Denpasar, Indonesia) – draft eGP Procurement Handbook
- 2013 – ADB published e-Government Procurement Handbook

ADB support to eGP initiatives in Asia and Pacific

- Case studies (PRC, IND, ARM, PHI)
- Country specific support (Philippines, Kyrgystan, Indonesia)
- eGP surveys (2011, 2014, 2017)
- Asia Pacific Public Electronic Procurement Network (APPePN) established with ADB and Government of Korea funding (TA 8520)
- 4 conferences – Manila (2015), Seoul (2016), Tbilisi (2017), Washington (2018)
- Scoping workshop for eGP Software-as-a-Service, competitive selection of SAAS provider, configuration workshop for shared SaaS

What was achieved?

The TA funded 2 comprehensive surveys on e-GP implementation in ADB DMCs, 4 annual conferences, 3 regional workshops, multiple e-GP assessments and several knowledge products. Reports and knowledge products were disclosed at ADB e-GP portal and on www.adb.org

Summary of achievements for RETA 8520 and rationale for follow-up RETA

- ADB and other multilateral development banks (MDBs) assessed multiple e-GP installations throughout the region and endorsed their use on International Financial Institutions (IFIs)-funded procurement transactions. The digitization era is helping to accelerate its deployment. RETA 8520 funded 4 annual conferences in Manila (2015), Seoul (2016), Tbilisi (2017) and Washington (2018). The 4th annual conference was a follow-up event to the Global Public Procurement Conference held jointly with the Inter-American Network on Government Procurement and Inter-American Development Bank in Washington, DC together with 8 other development partners, providing a unique opportunity for APPePN members to learn from and connect with public procurement professionals from around the world . It is important for ADB to foster greater regional cooperation and knowledge sharing through the proposed TA.
- While significant progress has been achieved, areas for further development, especially in areas of cross-border and global trade and cooperation and seamless integration with other parts of e-government and banking applications remain untapped. ADB in its capacity as a trusted regional development partner can play a key role in leveraging its current digitization programs to benefit public procurement outcomes.
