

- More than 110,000 deaths




Daily new confirmed COVID-19 cases, Sep 8, 2020

Shown is the rolling 7-day average. The number of confirmed cases is lower than the number of actual cases; the main reason for that is limited testing.

COVID-19 and UHC

- 1. Many health service providers are prioritizing COVID-19 services at the expense of other essential healthcare
- 2. People are foregoing health care for fear of an increased risk of COVID-19 infection at health facilities
- 3. Progress towards UHC has been greatly affected and highlights the dire need to invest in resilient systems




Promoting UHC during COVID19
