Accelerating use of e-government procurement tools to facilitate project procurement

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Background

- Public procurement is traditionally risk averse and rule bound.
- In 2011 only 1/3 of the Developing Member countries (DMCs) started implementing eGP
 - By 2017, 2/3 of the countries had made the shift!
- The COVID19 pandemic has accelerated the adoption and use of digital commerce and digital procurement.
- eGP has moved from "nice to have" to "must have" category practically overnight!



Development Challenge

The public expects Governments to...

- Continue providing essential services, including services of utilities, communications and crucial digital infrastructure.
- Step in to procure life-saving medical equipment, personal protective equipment, testing facilities, emergency supplies
- Have an economic recovery plan which is likely to have a substantial infrastructure component.



Delivery Challenge

- Substantial number of sophisticated eGP solutions <u>are not</u> designed with a view of foreign participation and cross-border trade.
- Some ADB member countries do not have any e-government procurement systems or only recently started piloting its use.
- Large procurement packages normally follow International Competitive Bidding procedures.
 - Prior to COVID 19, these were mostly procured using paper-based procedures with physical presence of bidders required.
- Normal bidding processes & logistics became impossible during lockdowns, border closures, and restrictions on public gatherings.



Potential solutions if the country has an eGP system <u>not yet approved</u> for ICB / OCB

- A. Wait & See / Postpone / Delay procurement of large value contracts
- B. Modify existing system & procedures
- Remove barriers to entry, requirements for physical documents certification. Consider post-qualification / verification.
- Replace requirements for bid security w/ bid securing declaration.
- Use additional technological solutions to supplement / substitute physical opening (i.e. Skype, Teams, Zoom, Webex, etc.).
- Create digital records / video-records of bid opening procedures.
- Proactively design solutions for potential complaints.



Potential solutions if the country does not have eGP system

- If procurement package is funded by ADB, request that ADB assist with an "interim solution." We are here to help!
- Sign up for Software-as-a-Service (SaaS) e-procurement system.
- If ADB Member, use ADB sponsored SaaS, provided by InTend (UK)
 more information on this in Session #3.
- Replace requirements for bid security with bid securing declaration.
- Use additional tech solutions to supplement / substitute physical opening (i.e. Skype, Teams, Zoom, Webex, etc.).
- Proactively design solutions for potential complaints.




What can ADB do for you?

- Approve extended use of national eGP platforms, mitigating risks.
- Refer borrowers to InTend SaaS & their on-boarding to the system which can be used irrespective of the fund source for procurement.
- Provide centralized portal to facilitate bank-funded procurement for use by ADB borrowers.
- For consulting services packages, use ADB Consultant Management System delegate issuance of RFP & receipt of proposals to ADB.
- Consider use of low-tech solutions / secure email. Mitigate risks by requiring encryption/ password protection of bids.

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
