# Origins and purpose

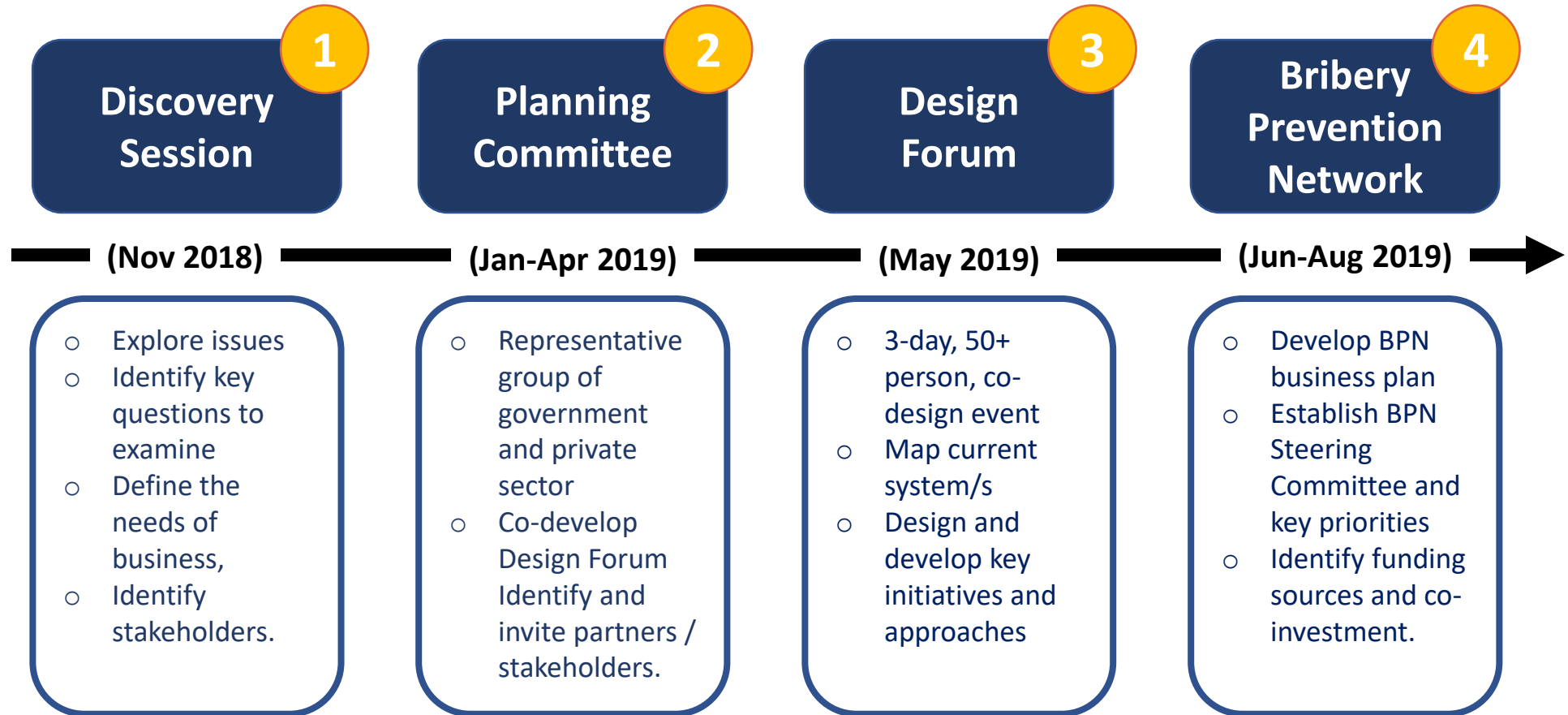
Australia's Phase 4 review by the OECD Working Group on Bribery:

- “Find additional ways to encourage companies, particularly SMEs, to develop and adopt adequate internal controls, ethics, and compliance programmes for the purpose of preventing and detecting foreign bribery”

# Our Future

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## PHASED APPROACH

The Bribery Prevention Hub will develop over three phases:

- Minimum viable product and proof of concept – Year 1 and into Year 2 - **CURRENT**
- Dynamic portal with user-driven content – Years 2 and 3
- Full ecosystem of information users and providers – Years 4 and 5

## NEXT STEPS

- Socialise the Bribery Prevention Hub with SMEs
- Deliver webinars
- Test the Bribery Prevention Hub with SMEs to assess whether it is fit-for-purpose
- Scope out the future technical requirements and capabilities of the Hub
- Review the funding model of the Bribery Prevention Network and diversify future funding to ensure long term sustainability
