



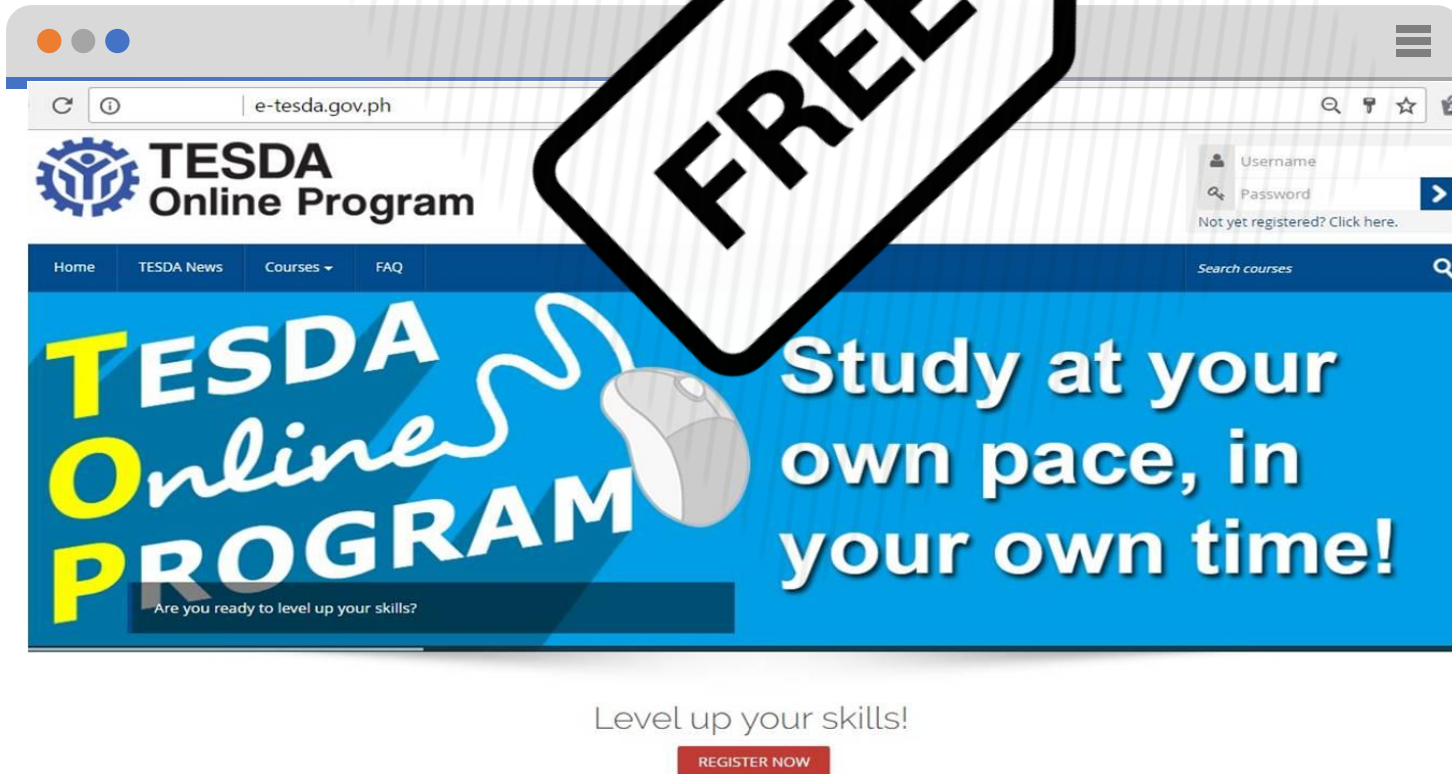

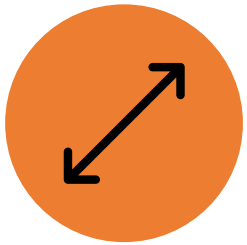
The TESDA Online Program (TOP) is an open educational resource that aims to make technical education accessible to more Filipino citizens, through the use of information and communication technology.

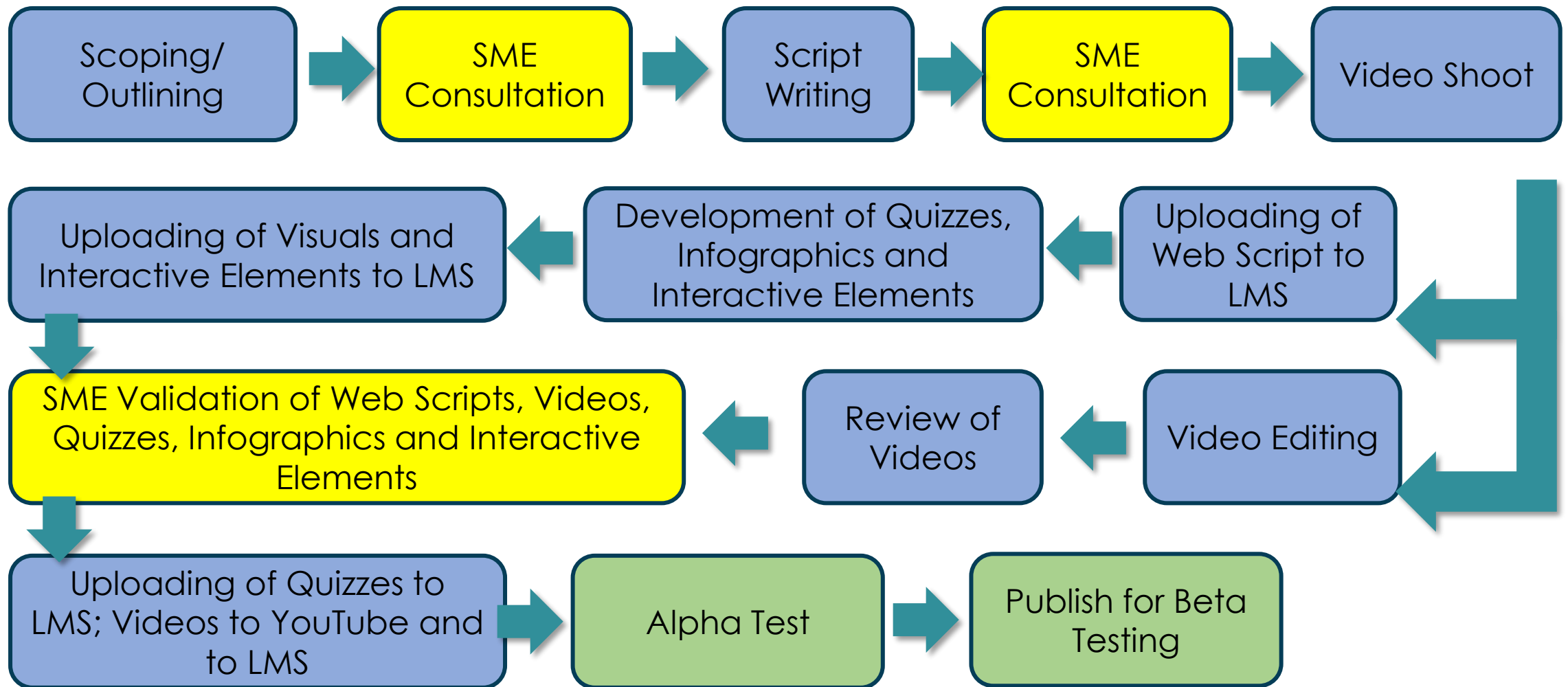

Challenges

LMS Hosting

Slow/no internet connection

Capability of trainers to run online/blended learning program

Limited resources

Funding source

Solutions to challenges

- Moved to cloud hosting
- Trained trainers in implementing flexible learning delivery approaches
- Trained trainers to develop their own elearning materials
- Provision for offline versions of the LMS using low-cost hardware
- Partnership agreements with National Government Agencies, Non-government Organizations and other companies
