

### Pandemic has profoundly impacted growth & development




- Global economic loss in 2020 from \$4.8–\$7.4 trillion
- Developing Asia lost \$1.4-\$2.2 trillion (about 28% of total)
- By end-2020, the pandemic had pushed 78 million more people into extreme poverty (\$1.90 per day)




### The Risk of a K-shaped recovery & equitable digitalization

Digitalization of pandemic response can help mitigate divergence and enable attainment of the 2030 Agenda






#### - Institutional strengthening and policy coherence


Local governments play a critical role in providing service delivery that will bring inclusion, efficient use of resources and sustainability

Mobilizing sufficient financing remains a major challenge in implementing the 2030 Agenda











Many countries in developing Asia fail to generate threshold tax yields at or above 15% of GDP


Domestic resource mobilization and increased private investment critical for SDG financing.


# Enabling Environment for Localizing SDGsData & Monitoring

Accessible, comprehensive and communicable data will enhance monitoring of SDGs and contribute to evidence-based policy making and increase viability for investments in subnational and local governments











Community-led monitoring of SDGs provides alternative approaches and perspectives to data generation and use, which can complement the monitoring efforts of the government.


