
Localizing the SDG is important because

Our ambition is to LNOB and its also an opportunity to rethink inclusive & sustainable territorial development:

- 'Pockets' of poverty and regional disparities still exist within countries and require tailored development interventions
- 'Leaving no one behind' calls for innovative development strategies that goes beyond traditional vertical sector approaches (tradeoffs, accelerators).



The SDGs will only be achieved if a 'whole of society' is involved and innovative partnerships developed to implement and finance.






LNOB:

Under the MDGs, despite high enrolment rates, Sopia was amongst children who couldn't go to school.


For her to enroll 13 institutions & 8 SDGs are involved.
