Total 24 countries in Southeast Asia, South Asia and Central Asia. Sustainable Consumption and Production (SCP) aims at improving the overall environmental performance of products throughout their life cycle, stimulates demand for better products and production technologies and helps consumers make informed choices. The European Union is committed to tackle these global challenges together with its partners in Asia and Central Asia. Launched in 2007, its SWITCH-Asia programme has achieved more than a decade of progress on SCP in 24 countries in the region.

Testing and adopting greener and more sustainable industrial processing in MSMEs, promoting greener products and more sustainable consumption patterns and behaviours in Asia.




POLICY DIALOGUE





From Grants to Policy Dialogue: Two-levels Approach Interconnected







Through its **grants scheme** the programme funds pilot projects **helping consumers** to act more responsibly in their daily choices and lifestyles as well as **helping companies** to adopt cleaner technologies and more sustainable industrial practices.

This latter will ultimately support local companies to more easily access the supply chains of multinational companies seeking to establish green and fair conducts within their value-chains.

The evidence provided by projects is meant to **feed into policy** and regulatory discussions with national governments.

The programme provides technical assistance to governments, supporting them in improving their national strategies and action plans with regard to sustainable production and consumption practices.

It also carries out advocacy activities at regional level.

Valuing SWITCH-Asia Work & Synergies



Strengthen interconnection and synergies between/with Grant Projects, RPAC and SCP Facility, together with EU Delegations, NFPs, and partner organisations.



Strengthen interconnection and synergies within thematic clusters across region.
