






ADB Project Cycle

- Supply of goods
 - Machinery, equipment, computers, furniture
- Civil works
 - Roads, railways, bridges, irrigation canals, schools, power plants, pump stations, water treatment plants, heating plants, airports, etc.
- Consulting services
 - Project Management (PMC), Design & Site supervision (DSC), Master Planning, Project preparation, Advisory, Knowledge Products, Financial Management
- Non-consulting services
 - Surveys, training, translation, event management

Roles and Oversight Mechanism in ADB Procurement




Loan

- Borrower does procurement → the Client
- ADB in oversight role
- Client pays (ADB may do on behalf)
- Law of borrower's country generally applies
- Contracts subject to tax
- Complaints to borrower, may copy ADB

Technical Assistance

- ADB does procurement → the Client
- Direct payment by ADB
- Provision of Privileges and Immunities applies (expert on mission)
- Complaints to ADB
