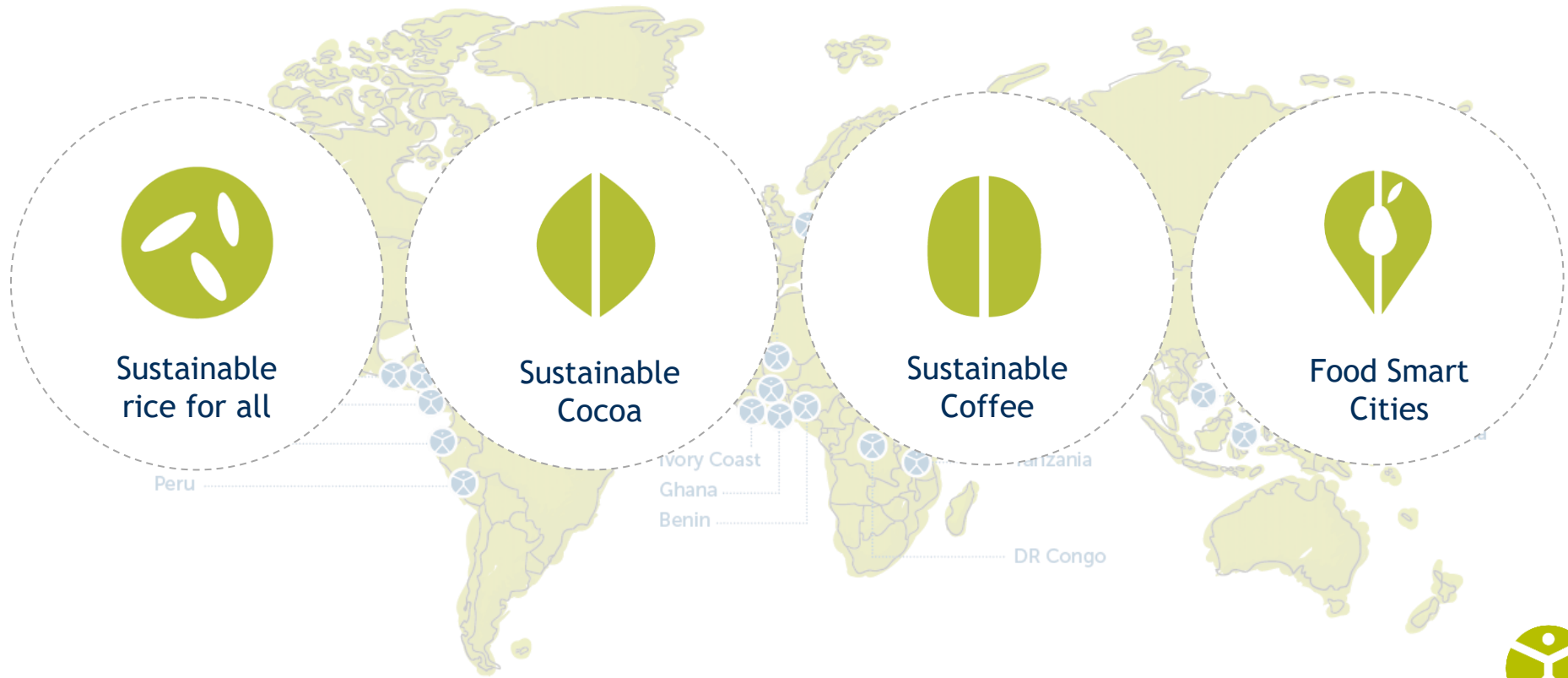

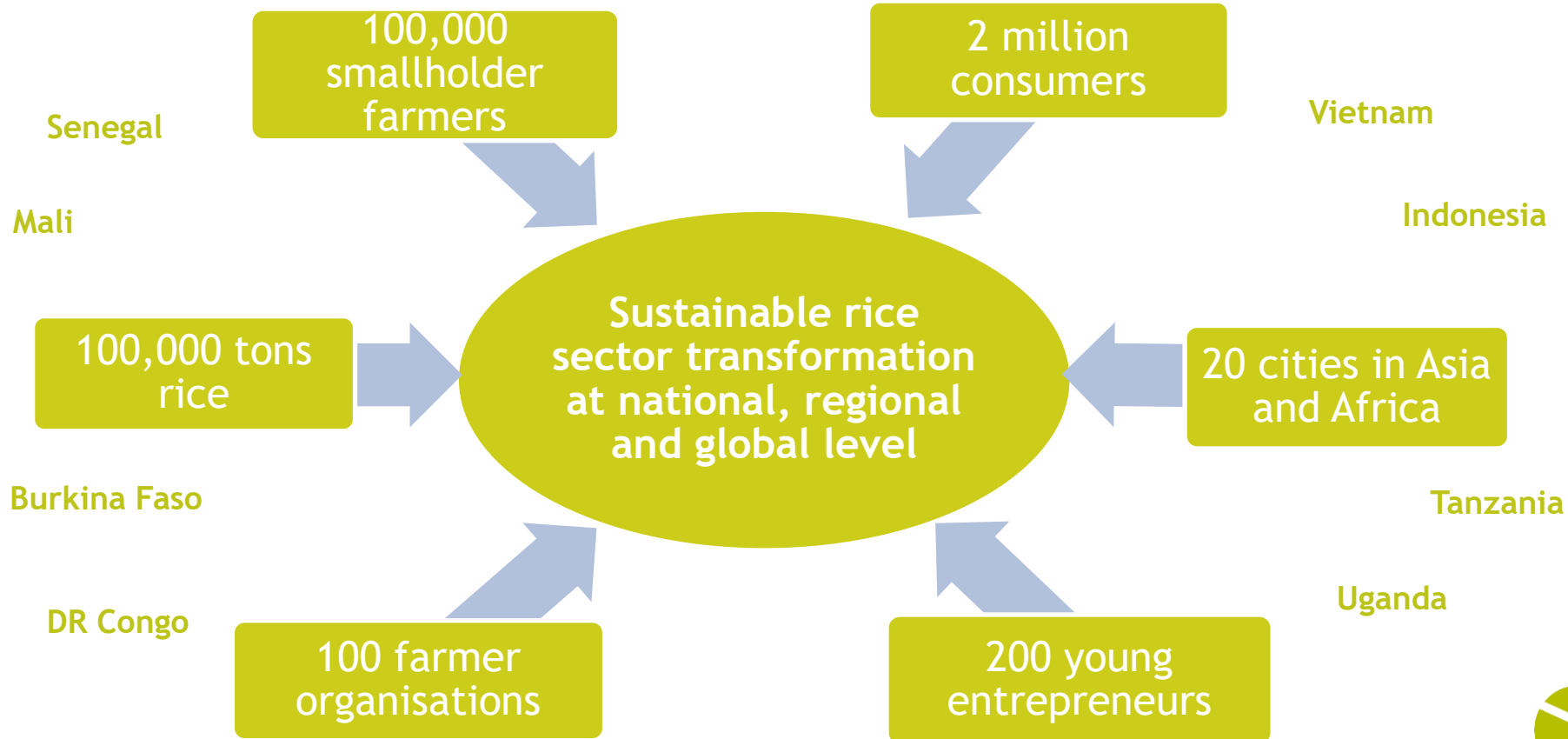

What is Sustainable Rice Platform (SRP) Standard?

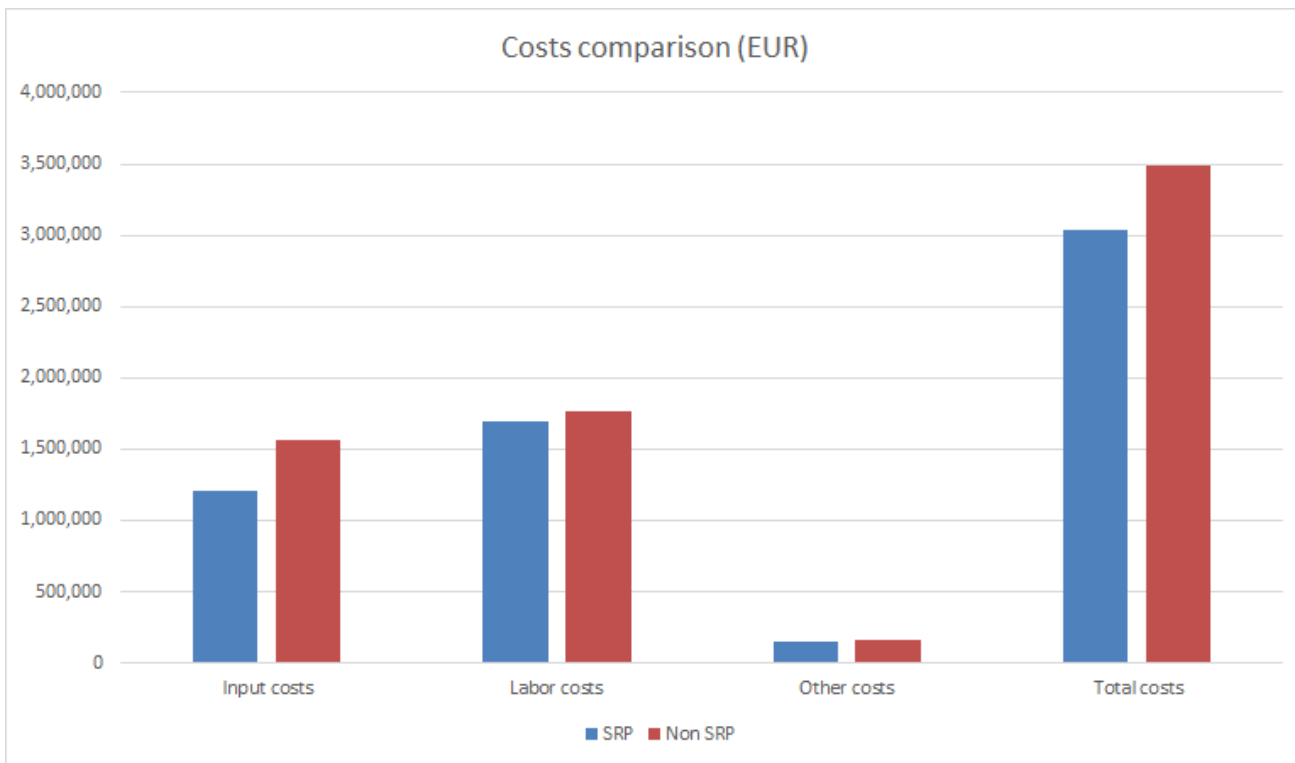
- ✓ Inclusive tool for practitioners to drive wide-scale adoption of climate-smart sustainable best practice among rice smallholders
- ✓ SRP Standard has 41 requirements, structured under 8 themes:
 - Farm management
 - Preplanting
 - Water use
 - Nutrient management
 - IPM
 - Harvest and post harvest
 - Health and safety
 - Labor rights
- ✓ Measuring 12 performance indicators:
 - Profitability
 - Labor productivity
 - Productivity: grain yield
 - Water productivity and quality
 - Nutrient use efficiency: N & P
 - Biodiversity
 - Greenhouse gas emission
 - Food safety
 - Health and safety
 - Children labor and youth inclusion
 - Women empowerment

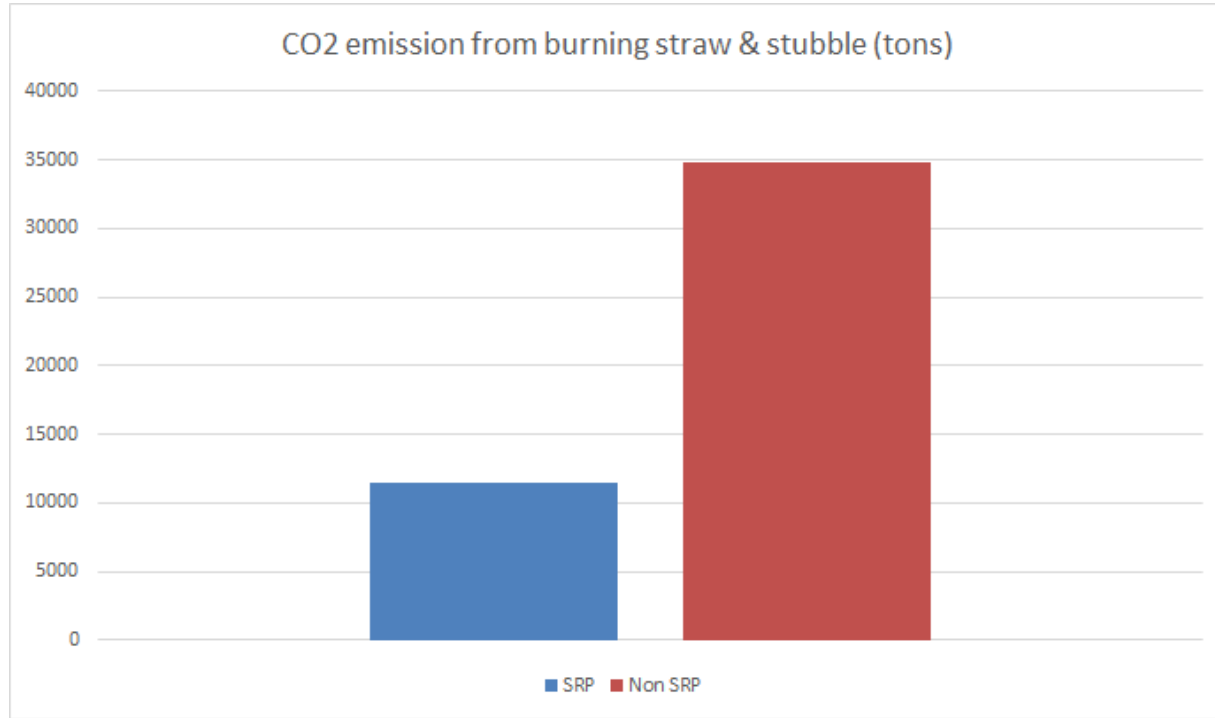
SRP vs. non-SRP: economic perspective
