




SUPPLY

Tools to mitigate corruption risks





Immediate Response Preventative measures



Install a specialized committee to oversee emergency funds and vaccine deployment

Implement secure storage and distribution systems

Call for more transparency in the vaccine procurement;

allocation criteria; and administration of vaccines

Strengthen civil society participation; reporting mechanism



Protect journalists and whistle-blowers



Immediate Response Law enforcement measures



Expediently investigate reported corruption cases linked to the allocation or administration of vaccines

Conduct parallel financial investigations





Establish communication channels between enforcement and delivery agencies



Get acquainted with relevant new legislation



Develop effective internal corruption investigation and resolution processes within the organizations involved in the allocation and administration of vaccines



Long-term measures

- Conduct corruption risk assessments
- Strengthen anti-corruption laws and policies
- Reinforce the auditing, oversight, accountability and corruption reporting mechanisms





RECAP FOR PROJECTS General considerations

Corruption risks exist throughout the vaccines supply chain

Projects need an anti-corruption component

Situation in one country can influence border countries

Prevention is better than cure

Corruption risks exist also in the procurement of other medical supplies and in services needed to administer vaccines



RECAP FOR PROJECTS Considerations for corruption mitigation

Consider communication channels (among agencies and with citizens) and transparency features

Anti-corruption authorities and civil society can be key oversight partners

Include complaint mechanisms

Analyze the interplay between transparency and privacy

Reduce information asymmetry



Example: Transparency during the administration of vaccines

What data should be made public?

To oversee the vaccine administration process, anti-corruption authorities/citizens require access to some personal data of those vaccinated. Countries must weigh between data protection and the social interest to have access to enough information to oversee the process.
