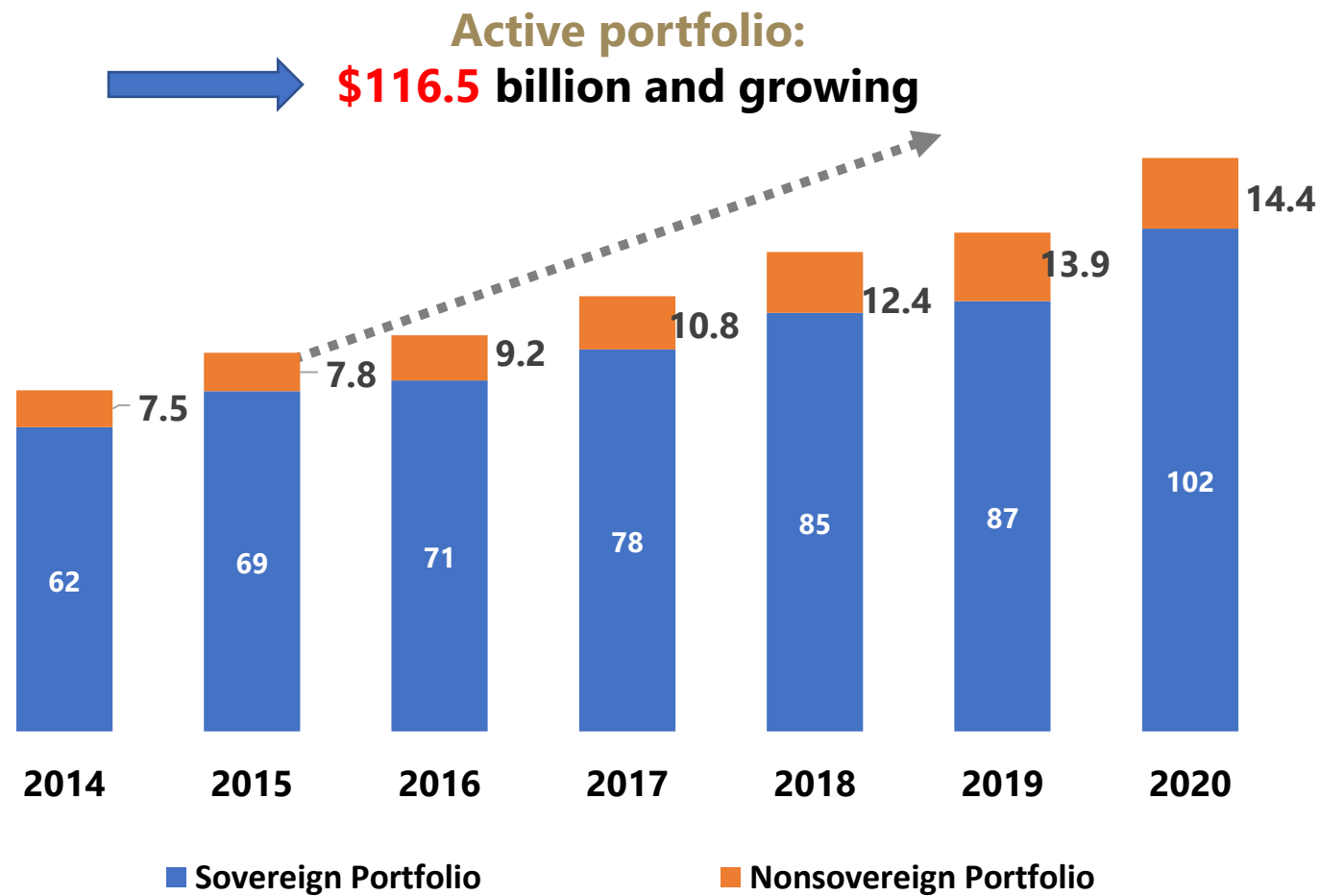


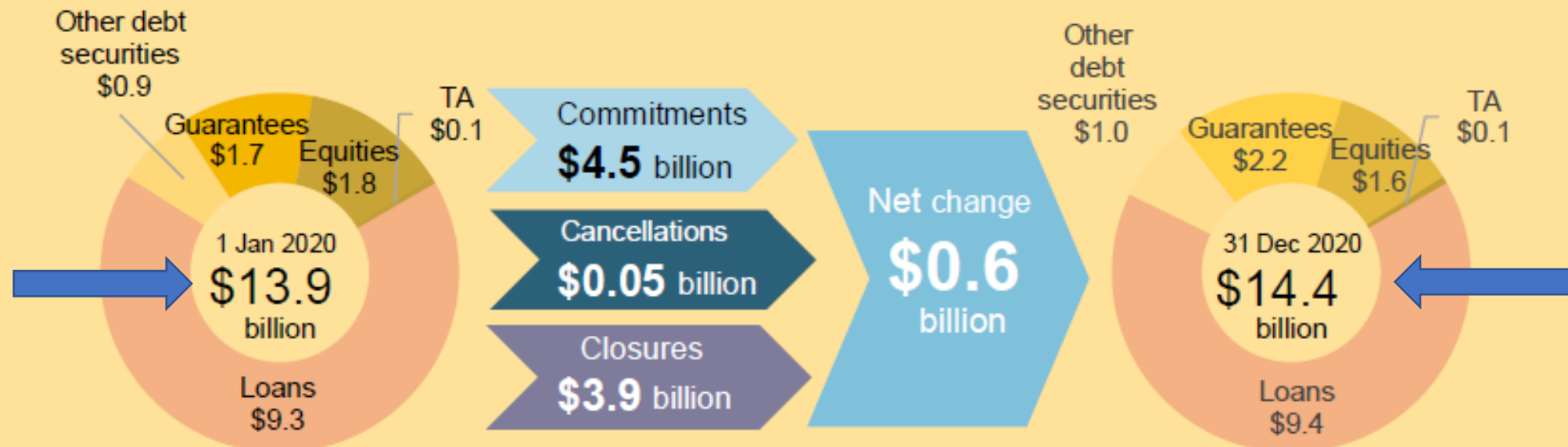
Figure 5: Sovereign Portfolio at a Glance

Figure 85: Nonsovereign Portfolio at a Glance



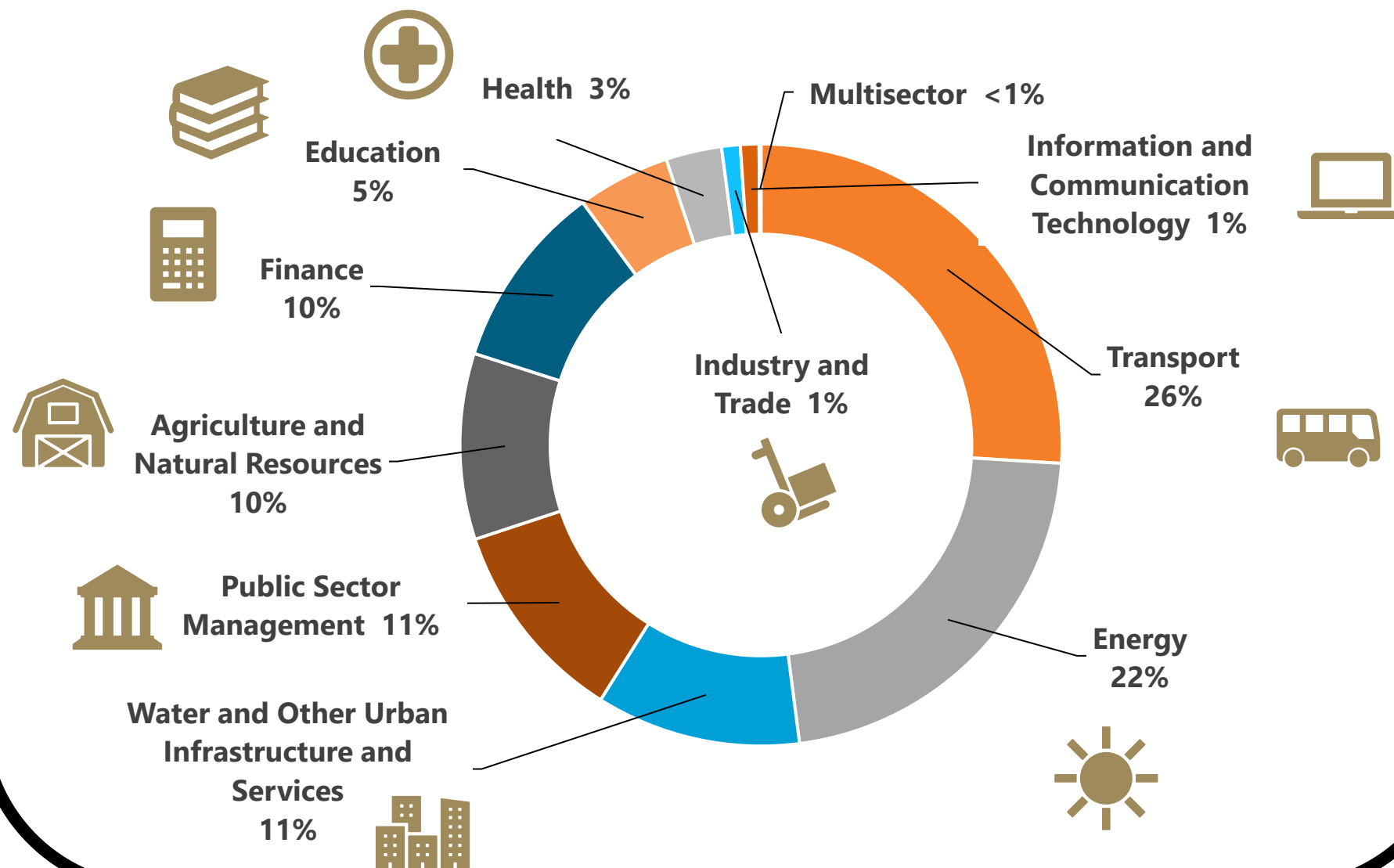

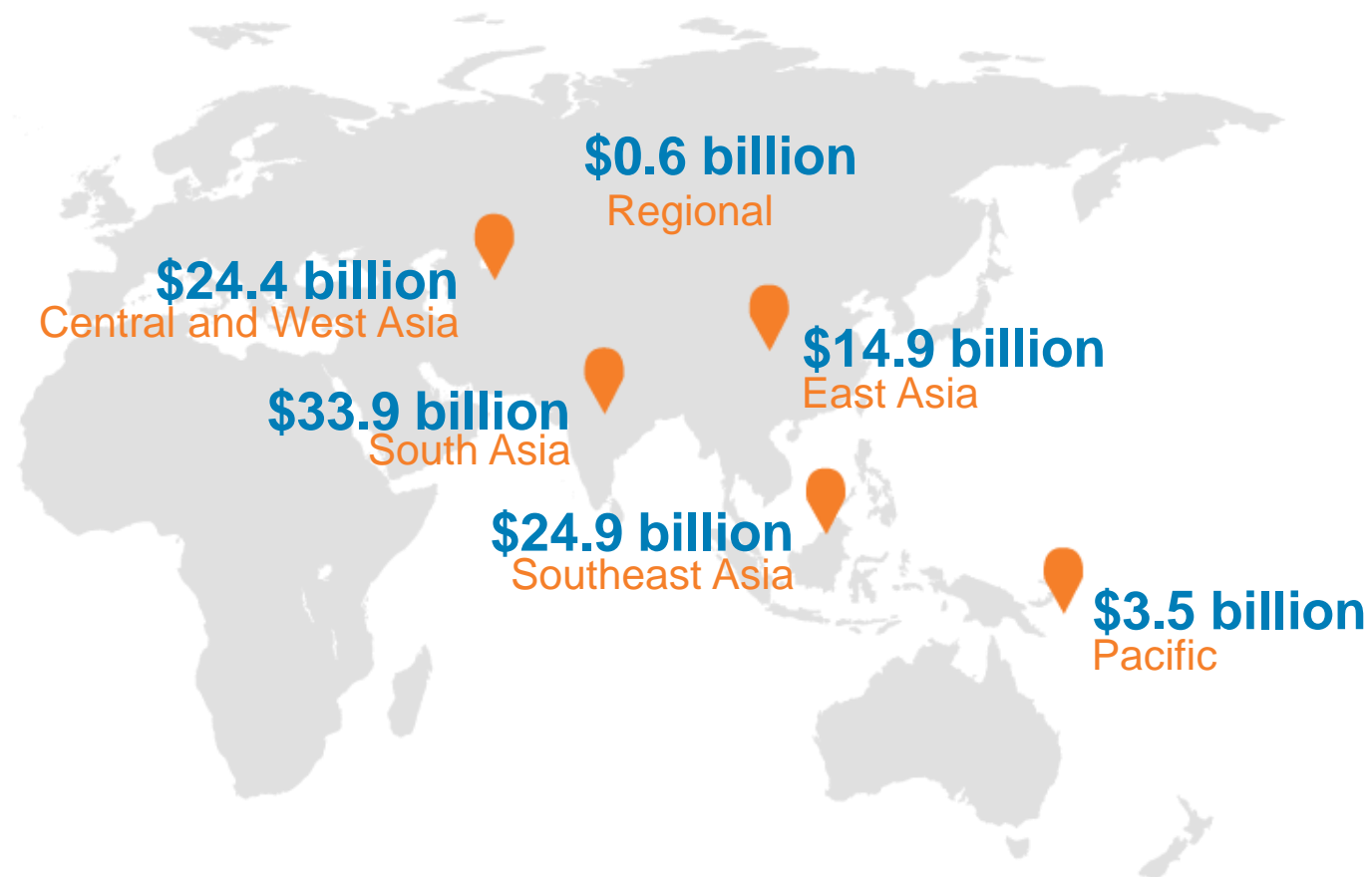

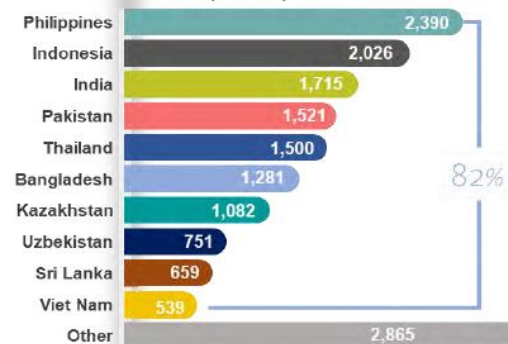

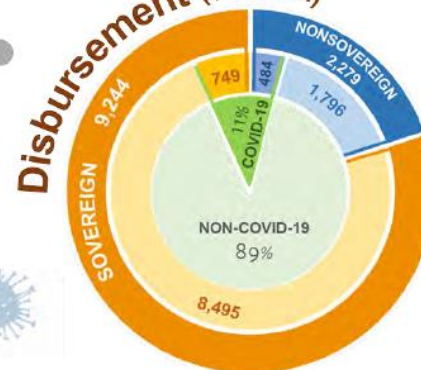
Commitment by Sector

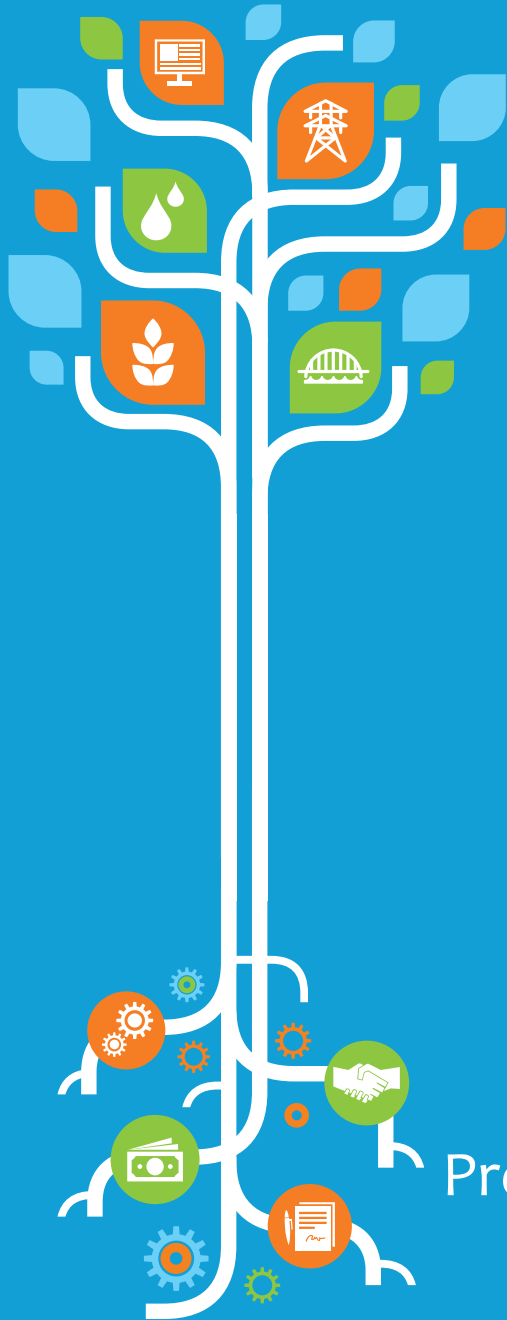
