### **Timeline:**

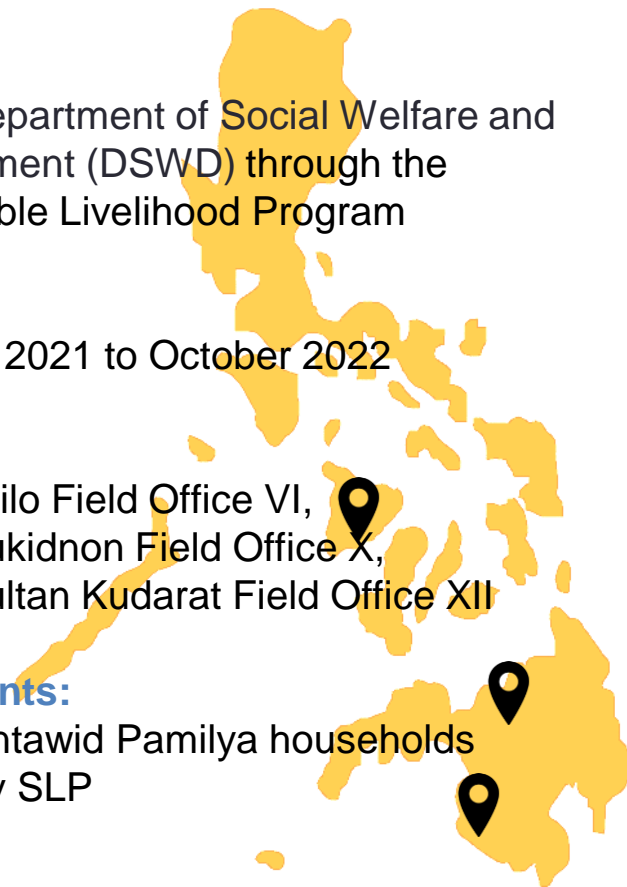
18 months – April 2021 to October 2022

3 Provinces – Iloilo Field Office VI, Bukidnon Field Office X, Sultan Kudarat Field Office XII

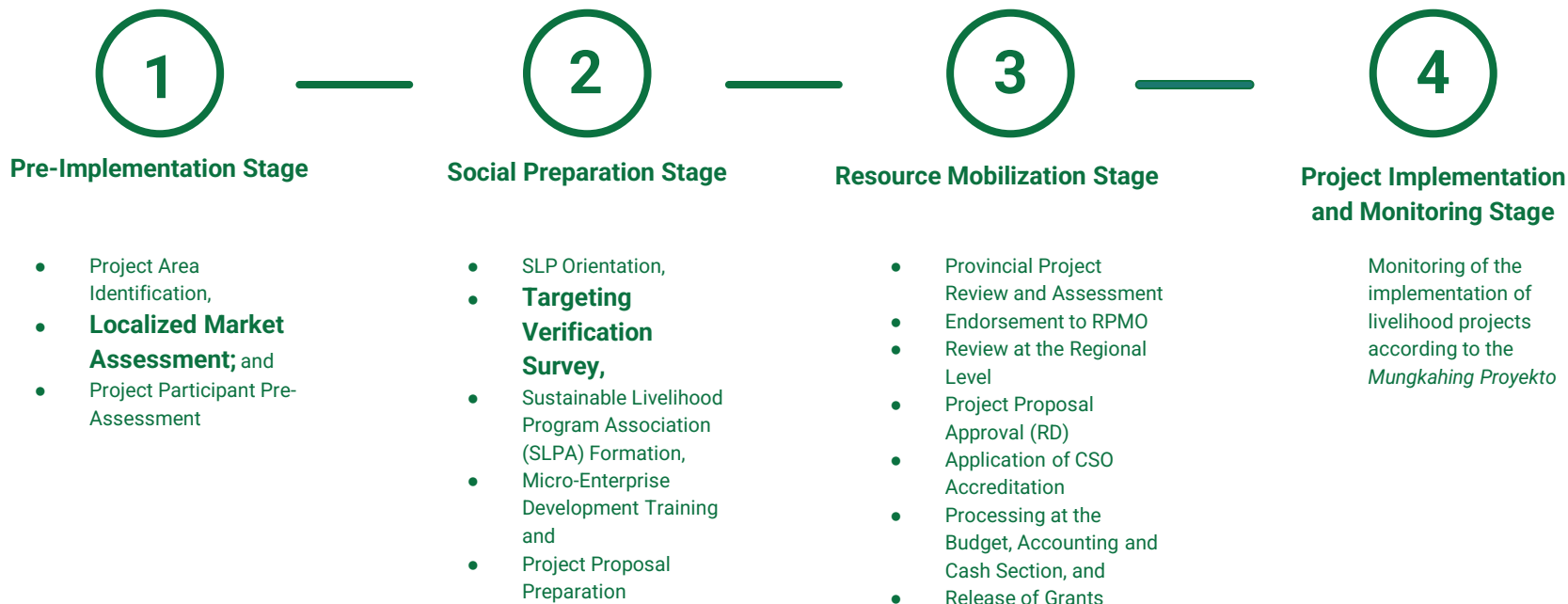
### **Project Participants:**

The pilot project is implemented in (four) 4 stages patterned after the regular implementation of SLP.



# Strengthening Resilience through “Padayon, SLP”

## Livelihood Market Assessment

- **Identify profitable livelihood options**
- **Ability to withstand from climate and disaster shocks and stresses**
- **Determine value chain map**
- **Analyze the relevant local market systems**

### Modified Livelihood Activities

- Food vending and sales
- Livelihood diversification
- Diversification and combining livelihoods from different (unrelated) sectors
- Identification of additional interventions
- Climate and disaster shocks and stresses considered in rural livelihoods
- Capacity building activities
- Localization of livelihood options

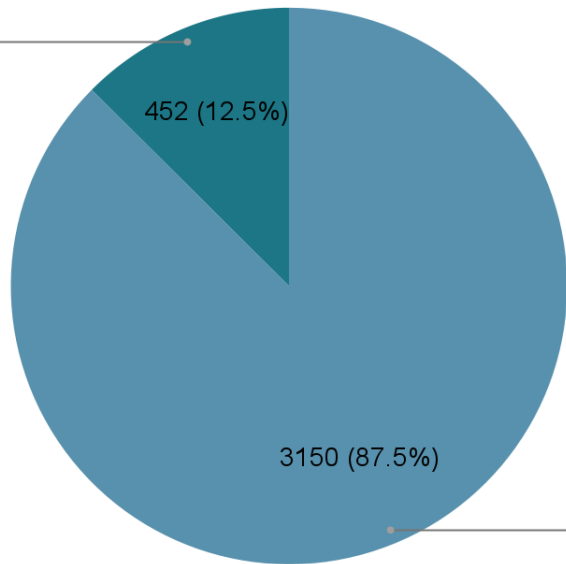
# Targeting Verification Survey (TVS)

- is a data collection activity that aimed to verify the eligibility of the targeted households for the “Padayon, SLP” projects.

## Eligible and Ineligible Households in TVS

- Food Security and Nutrition;
- Health, Hygiene, and Sanitation;
- Disaster Preparedness and Management; and
- Household Dynamics
