


A healthy diet is too expensive for 1.9 billion people in Asia and the Pacific, causing nutrition insecurity and hampering human capital development

NAURU: Urban agriculture for climate change adaptation and nutrition security (diet diversification)

- WASH + Urban agriculture : Reviving local vegetable and fruit production at home
- Climate chain adaptation: efficient and short-variety production with minimal land, water harvesting and protective structures
- Pandemic Recovery: Stable supply of fresh food with local production (reducing import dependence)
- Nutrition-smart: cost saving of healthy food, encouraging healthy eating to address obesity (the highest prevalence in the world)



Philippines: Mindanao Irrigation Development Project's Mother and Child Nutrition Component (Proposed)

Scaling up of the Food Always In The Home program to supply (FAITH)

- Nutrition-smart: Target at households with malnourished mothers. Home production of vegetables for food cost reduction for pregnant and lactating mothers and children
- Climate-smart: Introduction of lowcost and energy-saving high efficiency irrigation, short-term varieties.
- Pandemic Recovery: food production at available spaces, while on enhanced community quarantine
