Community and Occupational Health and Safety Purpose, Scope and Process of the Study

- Assessment of ADB's current approach to community and occupational health and safety, including elements covered through other ADB strategies and policies such as ADB Social Protection Strategy CLS (2001).

 Multilateral Finance Institutions (MFIs) in the area of Community and Occupational Health and Safety (COSH).

Occupational Health and Safety Policy Provisions – Occupational Health and Safety



- The **borrower/client** will provide **workers** with a safe and healthy working environment, taking into account risks inherent to the particular sector and specific classes of hazards in the borrower's/client's work areas, including physical, chemical, biological, and radiological hazards.
- Prevent accidents, injuries, and disease arising from associated with or occurring during the course of work.
- Emergency preparedness and response arrangements at the workplace.
- Recognizes the Hierarchy of Risk Control avoid, minimize, manage
- Refers to internationally recognized standards such as WBG EHS.



Occupational Health and Safety Policy Provisions – Occupational Health and Safety



- The borrower/client will identify and assess the risks to, and potential impacts on, the safety of <u>affected communities</u> during the design, <u>construction</u>, <u>operation</u>, and <u>decommissioning</u>, of the project, and will establish preventive measures and plans to address them in a manner commensurate with the identified risks and impacts.
- Covers risks arising throughout the entire project cycle design to decommissioning.
- Covers both <u>accidental</u> and <u>natural</u> hazards where project structural elements could exacerbate them.
- Emergency Prevention and preparedness response planning for communities.
- Clarifies expertise for projects in high-risk location dams etc.

Findings from Comparator Analysis Differences and Gaps in Scope and Coverage – Occupational Health and Safety


- Structure Placed within Environmental safeguards, COSH risks also includes Social safeguards.
- Content High-level principles and requirements, quite generic, lack details in many areas.
- Silent on Linkages to labor & working conditions (note, labor is in ADB Social Protection Strategy, 2001)
- Doesn't specify at which stage(s) of the project cycle Borrower/Client requirements should be in place.
- Silent on <u>expertise and level of Risk Assessment and Management Planning</u> required to be undertaken for both generic and sector specific.
- Silent on OHS risks associated with operations, decommissioning, transport of goods and services.
- Silent on Worker Responsibilities towards management of OHS risks at the worksite.
- Silent on the implementation of the OHS provisions throughout project cycle
- Does not provide linkage to prevention of pollution risks to human health and environment
- Sexual Exploitation Abuse and Harassment (SEAH): Worker-to-Worker SEAH risks

Findings from Comparator Analysis Differences and Gaps in Scope and Coverage – Occupational Health and Safety

- Structure Placed within Environment safeguards but COSH risks also includes Social safeguards
- Silent on client/borrower role when CHS risks are managed by relevant public authority notify, cooperate and monitor.
- Silent on project security risks to communities
- Silent on Biodiversity and ecosystems.
- Does not provide linkage to prevention of pollution risks to human health and environment.
- Silent on Climate Change and other vulnerabilities to affected communities
- Sexual Exploitation Abuse and Harassment. Worker-to- community SEAH Risks
- Traffic and Road Safety ADB Road Safety Plan

GUIDANCE NEEDED TO IMPLEMENT POLICY PROVISIONS

- Roles and responsibilities of client/borrower, contractor, government agencies, workers, affected communities needs more definition
- Guidance needed to strengthen risk screening, assessment management planning
- Budget allocation for COSH implementation in bid documents / contracts to cover: (I) OHS personnel recruitment (2) provision of equipment (type specific following risk assessment); and (3) training
- Monitoring and reporting needs strengthening including fatalities, major incidents and action plans
- Grievance Redress Mechanism for workers (in addition to community).
- Capacity needs and multiple levels country legislative and institutional requirements and project level.
- Skills COSH Expertise for sector/type specific risk assessment and management

Community and Occupational Health and Safety For Further Consideration



Occupational and community health and safety:

- **Project level security –** Arrangements and risks to workers and affected communities
- Product safety and safety of project services to communities
- Project related traffic and road safety
- Mental health and wellbeing of workers
- Project related fire risks to workers and community
- Hazardous chemicals and materials e.g. Asbestos review of allowance for use of bonded asbestos with ADB Prohibited Investment Activities List (Appendix V of SPS)

Cross cutting areas

- Ecosystems Services limited to provisioning and regulating services
- Animal health and safety
- Sexual exploitation abuse and harassment risks (worker-to-worker and worker-to-community impacts





- I. ADB SPS provisions on COSH generally covers most of the aspects set out in other MFI approaches but very generic and high-level lacking clarity and Guidance for implementation
- II. Other MFIs largely follow sub-standards model.
 - ADB would like to develop specific standard for Community and Occupational Health and Safety as part
 of overall Safeguard Policy Update, with strong links to the ESIA PS.
 - ADB will need to supplement the policy with updated guidance material
- III. Policy will need to place greater requirements on borrowers/clients to assess risks and achieve effective compliance with regards to community and occupational health and safety
- IV. Opportunity to introduce new concepts, such as ecosystem services, use of security forces, mental health and wellbeing, animal health and safety within ADB Safeguard processes.
