


Multiple burdens of malnutrition in Asia




- More than 2 billion adults are overweight and obese

- Wasting prevalence in Asia is 9.1%

Malnutrition prevalence and access to healthy food in ADB's Developing Member Countries




% of Population without access to nutrient adequate food








Protectional and Promotional Approaches of ADB to Exist Support UN Decade of Action on Nutrition (2016–2025)

Universal child grants and food stamps for poor and vulnerable households in wake of COVID-19

Approved \$73 million in March 2021 to protect Mongolian children and their families from nutritional risks due to the pandemic

Supports four regional crop research institutes increase vegetable production

Competitive and Inclusive Agriculture Development Program

Provides short-term support for targeted social assistance to national feeding program to tackle malnutrition and stunting; builds long-term capacity to modernize agriculture





ADB SUPPORT to NUTRITION: Indonesia

Horticulture Development of Dryland Areas Project

Adopts an integrated approach to improve vegetable and fruit farm productivity, profitability, and supply chain





ADB's multi-sectoral approach to nutrition security









Tackling climate change, building climate and disaster resilience, and enhancing environmental sustainability







Strengthening governance and institutional capacity



- Establish a multi-sectoral working group on nutrition security
- Prepare a Strategic Framework for increasing ADB support to nutrition security over the next 3–5 years
- Apply and scale-up new approaches to nutrition-smart agriculture, nutrition fortification, and integrate more nutritional focus in social safety net support
